Mackerel News.

The prospect of mackerel on the Maine coast are not too brilliant at present. The fleet have scoured the coast from Boon island to Mount Desert, and no fish have been taken since a week ago to-day. Quite a number of the fleet have come to the westward and are now in Boston Bay. The whales which have been on the Maine coast have disappeared, and when the mackerel were last seen, they were going fast to the southward.

There are eight arrivals here to-day with from 50 to 250 barrels. They all report fish scarce the past week.

Schs. W. B. Leen and Arrow got good fishing in Ipswich Bay, off Newburyport, on Thursday, the former getting 100 and the latter 50 barrels.

The netters did finely off here last night, getting big hauls. They sold at 6 1-2 and 7 cents apiece for their fish at the Fort this morning.

There are six netters at Rockport this morning with 4000 fresh mackerel.

The only arrival at Boston is one small boat with five barrels of fresh tinkers.

The fares of schs. Hattie E. Heckman and Elenora sold to Reed & Gamage at \$11 per bbl. for rimmed and \$10 for plain.

The fare of sch. A. S. Caswell sold to John Pew & Son at \$10 5-8 per bbl.

MONSTER FARE.

Sch. Helen Miller Gould Had 700 Barrels of Mackerel.

GOOD FARES ALSO AT BOOTHBAY.

Capt. Jacobs Has Good Lead In High Line Contest.

Capt. Solomon Jacobs of sch. Helen Miller Gould celebrated Labor Day by arriving from a seining trip with the largest mackerel fare of the season, 450 barrels salt mackerel and 250 barrels fresh mackerel.

It was certainly a rousing trip, and the big vessel was nearly full. Beside this, her deck was cumbered with barrels and the dory was kenched full, while there was another kench on the house. She certainly looked fishy.

The Gould hauled in at Fort wharf and sold her fresh fare to John Nagle at 15 cents each for large and 4 cents for medium, who with his hustling gang began to count and ice the fish as the crew passed up from the held.

The news that the Gould was in with such a big fare quickly spread around town, and during the forenoon crowds of sight-seers thronged the wharf to have a look at the craft and her large fare.

Capt. Jacobs was visited by many vessel owners and seining skippers, and in reply to many questions said that he took the fish Saturday afternoon 15 miles north northeast of Cashes, and that there were about 20 or 25 sail of seiners there.

The Gould got about 200 barrels in two schools, and on the third set got round a school of fully a thousand barrels, and saved what Capt. Jacobs estimated to be 500 barrels. Only four hours before the fish began to show a large number of seiners went to the westward, leaving only about 20 sail there when the fish came up. All the vessels there did not get mackerel, however.

Sch. Richard Wainwright got a 200 barrel haul, sch. Herald of the Morning got 100 bbls., sch. Jennie B. Hodgdon got 200 barrels and sch. J. E. Garland got 90 bbls. Schs. Frank Butler and Geneva Mertis also made good hauls.

Capt. Jacobs further reported that the fish were going off shore, the way they
