

WHERE ARE THEY?

Mackerel Fleet Have Not Seen Many Fish Lately.

Large Number of Arrivals Today with Small Fares.

Nineteen sail of the iseing fleet, most of them from the Maine coast, are at this port this morning with less than 2000 barrels of salt mackerel. Sch. Jennie B. Hodgdon has 300 barrels and schs. Norumbega and Puritan 200 barrels each. The others have from 30 to 150 barrels, so it is easy to see that the vessels have not done much the past two weeks. The skippers report that the fish have not shown lately and seemingly have gone down or struck off shore. All are now waiting for the next dark of the moon, which comes in about a week, when it is hoped that the fish can be again located.

RECORD BREAKER.

Sch. J. J. Flaherty Coming Home with a Monster Fare.

HAS 500,000 POUNDS SALT COD.

Largest Trip of Fish Ever Caught by Gloucester Vessel.

A dispatch to D. B. Smith & Co. states that sch. John J. Flaherty was at Pubnico, N. S., Monday, for water, with 500,000 pounds of salt cod on board.

The Flaherty is the largest fishing vessel hailing from this port and also carries the largest crew. She has been engaged all summer in the salt bank dory handline cod fishing under command of Capt. Charles Rudolph, one of the most successful skippers of the salt fishing fleet.

Capt. Rudolph is not given to hailing for more than he has, so when he arrives probably the last of this week, he will bring not only the largest fare of salt cod, but the biggest cargo of fish of any kind ever landed at this port and one of the largest in the history of the American fisheries.

RUN DOWN.

Sch. Carrie E. Sayward Sinks at Anchor on Quero Bank.

Crew Picked Off and Landed at Bridgewater, N. S.

Sch. Carrie E. Sayward of Provincetown, formerly of this port, engaged in the dory handline bank cod fishery, was run down and sunk on Quero Bank, while at anchor, on the night of Sept. 6, by the British fishing schooner Reliance.

The crew are safe at Bridgewater, N. S. The vessel was insured. Particulars of the disaster are lacking.

The Carrie E. Sayward was 62.18 tons gross, 59.97 tons net, built at Essex in 1879, and owned by Conwell Bros. of Provincetown.

The Sayward went ashore in Provincetown harbor during the memorable gale of November 27, 1898. She was then owned by Sayward Bros. of this city and was abandoned to the underwriters, who sold the wreck to Conwell Bros. for \$245. She was afterward floated and repaired.

UNUSUAL.

Four Fetched Halibut Fares in Port Unsold.

There are four fares of fetched halibut in port to-day and all of them are unsold. Indeed the first arrival, sch. Annie Wesley, is the only fare sold this season.

The vessels here are schs. Edward S. Eveleth, Joseph B. Maguire, American and Valkyria, and some of these have been here over a week.

The captain and owners do not appear to be anxious to sell, as they claim that the fetched fares yet to come are small.

The first sale of these four fares came this noon, when the sch. American, which arrived Sept. 7, disposed of her fare to W. H. Wanson & Son at 5 1/2 cents per pound.
