DURING A BLOW.

CREW OF THE HELEN MILLER GOULD SECURE 340 BBLs. MACKEREL.

Fish Taken off Sambro—Vessel Ran Into Halifax for Barrels and Salt.

The report that Capt. Jacobs had taken 400 barrels of mackerel is confirmed by a special dispatch to the NEWS today from Sch. Helen Miller Gould, reporting her arriving at Halifax, N. S. on Tuesday with 340 barrels of large mackerel caught off Sambro. It was blowing a gale at the time and the vessel put in for a harbor and to purchase barrels.

Large Mackerel.

E. P. Wanson has a fine display in one of his show windows which evidences the high degree which the culinary department of this establishment has reached. Prominent in the display is one of the largest mackerel on record. It weighs about 4 1/2 lbs. and has a length of 21 inches. It was caught by Mr. Samuel Lucas yesterday in Annisquam river.

Herring.

The Halifax Chronicle of Tuesday says: "The famous mackerel catcher, Sol. Jacobs, arrived in port yesterday in his clipper schooner, Helen Miller Gould. He is from the North Bay, bound home, and yesterday he managed to secure a large school of fish about 15 miles off Sambro. He came in here to purchase barrels and salt, in which to put them, having used up all the barrels and salt he had on

board with his catch in the North Bay. The Helen M. Gould has not got a license, and the department at Ottawa has been wired to secure permission for Capt. Jacobs to purchase what is necessary. The schooner is at F. D. Corbett's wharf, and quite a number of persons visited and inspected the clipper during the day."

The netting sloop Sarah brought in 150 fresh mackerel, while the netting sch. Gracie brought in a like amount. The fares sold to Wm. E. Dennett and the Gloucester Fresh Fish Company, the fish bring 16 cents apiece.

WEEKLY FISH RECEIPTS.

Cod Showing in all the Products Save Mackerel—Prices Firm.

The receipts of fish for the week ending today at this port make a respectable showing in some branches of the industry. As expected, mackerel have dwindled to almost nothing.

Most of the fleet have hauled up and those that remain out have not taken any fish for three weeks.

Some salt cod from Grand bank have arrived, and in this line receipts have been quite large.

The receipts of all kinds are as follows: fresh halibut 3 fares from Grand bank, 116,000 lbs. Salt codfish from Grand bank and Quero, 792,000 lbs.

From Georges there arrived 4 trips with an aggregation of 102,000 lbs. Fresh pollock from shore have come forward in abundance and 406,000 lbs. have been landed.

Fresh herring, domestic catch, show a total of 2139 bbls. and 145 bbls, of salted.

Fresh mixed ground fish have been in larger receipt than for some time and make a total of 684,000 lbs.

Mackerel make the poorest showing as only 185 bbls of salted have been landed, and 540 fresh in count.

The total amount of ground fish other than halibut wass 2,065,000 lbs.

Pickled fish of all kinds aggregated 2839 lbs. and fresh halibut 115,000 lbs.
