Mackerel News.

The foreign receipts of salt mackerel this week have been 1100 bbls; 731 bbls. from Nova Scotia and 381 bbls. from Ireland. Nova Scotia mackerel are mostly 3s, and quoted from \$9 to \$10 per bbl. according to quality and there is no change from last week. There is no change in Irish mackerel, the latest news stating that fishing is light, and no improvement to report.

Sch. Harvard arrived from her late Cape Shore trip this morning with 160 bbls. salt mackerel. But two of the seining fleet now remain to arrive, schs. Lewis H. Giles and Lena and Maud.

Sch. Lena and Maud was at Halifax, S., Tuesday for harbor with five bbls. of mackerel on board.

The imports of salt mackerel at Boston to date are 28,090 barrels.

The receipts of Irish and Norway mackerel this week are 381 bbls. Irish at Boston, 234 bbls. Irish, and 332 bbls. from Holland at New York, and 64 bbls. Irish at Philadelphia.

Gloucester Vessels Fined at Bay of Islands, N. F.

Customs Officials Are Looking Sharp for Offenders.

Boston, Nov. 17.—The revenue and all other laws are being vigorously enforced at Bay of Islands, N. F., and schs. American and Centennial were caught by the customs officials and fined \$280 and \$100 respectively for alleged violations of the revenue laws.

Schs. J. J. Flaherty and Atalanta loaded and sailed November 8.

SALT HERRING FARES.

Two of Them Arrive Here This Morning.

Schs. Atalanta and J. J. Flaherty Have Rough Passage.

Sch. Atalanta, Capt. Richard Wadding, arrived here this morning at 8 o'clock from Bay of Islands, N. F., with the first cargo of salt herring brought to this port this season.

At 9.30 o'clock the sch. J. J. Flaherty, Capt. Charles Rudolph, arrived from the same place with the second salt herring cargo at this port.

Both Capt. Wadding and Rudolph report long tedious passages of 11 days, being among the hardest homeward trips they ever made.

Both left together on November 8 and were in sight of each other every day. The wind varied from west to southwest and up to this morning not a sheet could be started on either vessel, it being a dead beat to windward all the way. Most of the time the vessels were under reefed sails or came along with only jumbo, foresail and riding sail set. It was a case of reef and haul down the jib every day of the passage, and the vessels sailed remarkably even. The Flaherty had her jib badly torn.
