HERRING NEWS.

Two Arrivals Today from Bay of Islands, N.F.

Herring Are Still Reported To Be Very Scarce.

Schs. Dreadnaught, Capt. Joseph V. Cusick, and J. J. Flaherty, Capt. John Bonia arrived at midnight Tuesday, from Bay of Islands, N. F. The former has a full cargo of frozen herring and the latter 800 barrels of frozen and 900 barrels of salt herring.

Both vessels left side and side a week ago Tuesday night about midnight and after a hard passage, encountering stiff northerly and westerly winds, arrived here together Tuesday at midnight, which is pretty even sailing for so many hundred miles.

Sch. Harvard left for home a week ago Sunday and Capt. Cusick thinks that sch. Joseph Rowe left the same night they did.

Capt. John Bonia of the Flaherty has made an unequalled record, having made three trips to the Bay of Islands this season. He first went down as mate of sch. Joseph B. Maguire of Boston, then mate of sch. Senator Gardner, and on the last trip he went master of sch. Senator Gardner and came back master of sch. J. J. Flaherty.

Capt. Cusick of the Dreadnaught reports herring scarce when they left and the fishermen getting discouraged and leaving. The vessels there when the vessels left were schs. Joseph Rowe, Lewis H. Giles, Richard Wainwright, Senator Gardner, Helen F. Whitten, Nourmahal, Carrie W. Babson, Maggie and May, and Corsair, beside about 20 sail of Nova Scotia and Newfoundland vessels.

A telegram to Orlando Merchant Monday from Capt. Thaddeus Morgan at Bay of Islands, N. F., states that there are no herring there and many of the fishermen have gone home. Capt. Morgan also wired that the ice was reported near and Mr. Merchant cabled schs. Oliver Wendell Holmes and Lewis H. Giles to leave the bay. Capt. Morgan will use his judgment and leave before the ice hems him in.

Sch. Dauntless is on the way home with a cargo of salt herring. She has some frozen herring.

Sch. Maggie and May is on the way home from Bay of Islands with a cargo of part salt and part frozen herring.

Advices from Placentia Bay, N. F., on Monday evening report a few herring there and prices high and rising.
