Fishing Fleet Movements.

Sch. Golden-Rod, while on the way home from Sydney, put into Louisburg, C. B., on Monday. They had encountered some cold weather and the vessel was iced up, but not badly. Capt. Ross denies the report that they thought the vessel would go down with the weight of ice upon her, and in regard to not being able to raise the mainsail said there was no use for it, as the riding sail was on the craft at the time. The worst of the ice was forward, and the hardest job they experienced was clearing the windless. He laughed at the story of he and his crew beating ice steadily for three days in order to keep the vessel above water. The captain also said that his vessel was iced up, "but," said he, "she wasn't iced up bad."

Provincetown.

Jan. 10.—Sch. Gov. Russell will be fitted at once for the halibut fishery. Sch. William A. Morse has resumed trawling after the annual haul off for painting and refitting, and made first set of trawls in Bay, Monday.

Steamer Vigilant has ceased fishing work until the spring months and gone into winter quarters.

Sch. Carrie D. Knowles, Capt. Colin Stephenson, is in the stream fitted for a north Atlantic whaling voyage, and will sail at the first favorable opportunity. With her departure Provincetown will have three whaling craft at sea, with two to sail later, the largest fleet to cruise from the port in several years.

Two hundred barrels of good-sized herring were taken Thursday in the Conwell trap at this place—the biggest haul by a single trap known at this point at this season of the year.

Herring News.

Sch. American, Capt. Clausen, arrived from Bay of Islands, N. F., this morning with a partial cargo of salt herring. Capt. Clausen reports herring high and scarce.

GLOUCESTER SHOULD HAVE ONE.

France is fitting out a new hospital ship for service among her fishing fleet which pursue this operation off the Iceland coast and on the Grand Banks. The craft is, as the name implies, a regular floating hospital, fully equipped with everything possible for ministering to the needs of sick or injured French fishermen. A competent corps of physicians with a number of skilled nurses are constantly on board. There are comfortable beds, clean linen, isolated wards for contagious cases, also a large supply of medicine, etc.

This ship makes regular rounds among the big fresh fishing fleet like a doctor going the daily route of his patient. The best of care and medicine is given and the hospital ship is really a boon to these hardy toilers of the sea, who pursue their dangerous calling on the fishing banks so far away from their homes in sunny France.

The English fleet in the North Sea also have their hospital fleet and these facts cause one to naturally ask why the United States does not have a similar craft to tend upon the big fleet, of vessels which fish from early spring to late fall from Quero to Grand Bank and the Virgin Rocks. The need of such a craft is apparent to all who own or man these vessels. A little work in the right direction might secure this much-needed craft, which would prove a blessing to our fishermen.
