


**STILL COMING.**

Mackerel Fleet Is Right on the Fish at the Present Time.

**BIG RECEIPTS AT NEW YORK.**

Thirty-Nine Vessels with 2800 Barrels Fresh Mackerel.



Thirty-nine trips of fresh mackerel at New York and more coming is the glad news from Fulton dock this morning.

The good tidings cause a smile of satisfaction and fine feeling all along the line. Even the "shack" was lost its interest and was forced to take second place in the conversation on "change."

Fourteen seiners and 25 netters is the story, and they have the fine aggregate of about 2800 barrels and possibly more.

This is the banner mackerel day of the season thus far, the receipts at New York being the largest for one day for several seasons.

Eight cents apiece for large and five cents for mediums are the prices paid, which are good, considering the amount of fish in.

Sch. Speculator, Capt. Wesley Farmer, has the largest fare 250 barrels, and the new sch. Florida, Capt. Edward Procter, on her maiden trip, leads the netters with 100 barrels of large fish.
