Fine Trip.

Sch. Golden-Rod, Capt. Norman Ross, arrived from the Cape St. George, N. F., grounds this morning with a fine fare of 8000 pounds of cod and 50,000 pounds of halibut. Capt. Ross is doing finely.

WORLD'S RECORD.

Sch. Gossip Weighs Out 204,435 Pounds Fresh Fish.

CREW MADE SHARE OF \$119.50.

Record Shack Stock of \$4490 Made on Trip.

Sch. Gossip, Capt. Antoine Courant, weighed off 204 435 pounds of fresh fish, as the result of her recent shack trip, 151,000 pounds being large cod.

This is the largest fare of fresh fish ever landed in the history of the fisheries of the world. It is certainly a top notch fare and it is pretty sure that Capt. Courant's proud record will remain undisturbed for some time to come.

On this big trip the enormous stock of \$4490 was made, out of which a crew of 21 men shared \$119.50 each. This is the largest stock and share ever made on a shack trip.

The price of shack is now way up. Some comparison with the price of last year can be made this way. On March 30 last year Capt. Courant brought in 173,000 pounds of fish, on which a stock of only \$1800 and a share of \$40 was made, yet this year on this trip, only about 31,000 pounds larger, the stock is \$2600 and the share \$79 larger.

MACKEREL AT NEWPORT.

Sch. Lizzie M. Center Arrived To-day with 60 Barrels Fresh.

A despatch from our regular correspondent at Newport announces the arrival at that place of the sch. Lizzie M. Center, Capt. Joseph Smith, with 60 barrels fresh mackerel. This is the only arrival up to noon.

A later despatch says that the fleet which sailed Tuesday are all returning to-day, after being out in the fog, with no fish. The netters did not get far enough off shore. The weather is moderate. Fish are reported schooling off Montauk.
