BIG BANK FARE.**Sch. Mabel D. Hines Has Largest Cod Trip of Season.****Captain Reports Fish Scarce on Grand Bank.**

Sch. Mabel D. Hines, Capt. Lovett Hines, arrived from Grand Bank last evening with what is probably the largest salt trip of the season, over 300,000 pounds of salt cod. As the fare will bring a big price, the largest stock of the season will be the result.

Capt. Hines has been very fortunate in getting his big fare, as he reports that fish at present and for the past month have been very scarce. He says that some of the fleet at present have not over 100,000 pounds of fish, and that some will be obliged to make one long trip to fill up instead of two trips as usual.

Capt. Hines has been fishing on Grand Bank for 29 years, and he says that fish are scarcer there this season than ever before in all his experience.

Capt. Hines' reputation as a successful skipper is too well known to need extended mention. Year in and year out he comes and goes in his easy, unassuming way, always bringing in the biggest kind of fares. He is very much a business man and generally gets the highest price for his fares. As an all around successful skipper he is hard to beat.

FINE STOCK.**Sch. Columbia's Bank Fare Brings Over \$9,000.****Sharesmen Receive \$322.14 Each for Their Part.**

Sch. Columbia, Capt. Charles Forbes, weighed off 239,696 pounds of salt cod as the result of her recent salt bank trip, stocking \$9019 83, the sharesmen getting the splendid share of \$322.14 for their part of the trip.

This is the best firm trip of the year, both in size, stock and share. The firm price is less than the outside price on salt cod, but the stock of over \$9000 is nevertheless a splendid one, the vessel having over 200,000 pounds of large fish.

Capt. Forbes of the Columbia, who is to be congratulated on his fine fare, is well known as one of the leaders of the salt bank fleet, a steady-going, hustling master mariner and a gentleman well liked afloat and ashore.

Sch. Dictator, Capt. Lemuel Spinney stocked \$2037 on her recent cod and halibut trip, the crew sharing \$44.27.

Bank Cod Go Up.

The fare of bank cod of sch. Margaret of Beverly sold to Reed & Gamage at \$3.50 per hundred weight for large and \$3 for medium. This is a raise of 15 cents per hundred weight on large and 10 cents for medium fish.

OFF RACE POINT.**Four Small Seiners Made Good Hauls Wednesday.****SEVERAL GEORGES TRIPS IN PORT.****Sch. Grayling Takes Mackerel of Yarmouth, N. S.**

Mackerel are reported schooling off Race Point and several fine fares are at Boston to-day as the result. The lucky crafts are as follows:

Several seiners are in from Georges to-day with small fares. All the skippers report lots of fog, and most of them are of the opinion that but for this, many more fish would have been caught on the bank.

Sch. Geneva Mertis, Capt. Alex. McCloud, arrived from the Bay of Fundy this morning with 57 barrels of salt mackerel taken last Saturday 50 miles east southeast from Mt. Desert Rock. Seven other vessels were there and all got small hauls. The fish were in small schools. Previous to this the Mertis landed 70 barrels fresh at Portland.

The auxiliary gasoline sch. Nathalie B. Nickerson, Capt. Eben T. Lewis, arrived at Boston at 11.30 this forenoon, with 200 barrels fresh mackerel taken on the shoal waters of Georges. The fish sold readily at 12 cents each for large and 6 cents for medium, and the fare will net a handsome stock.

Sch. Grayling of this port, Capt. Reuben Cameron, was at Yarmouth, N. S., a few days ago. She had on board 200 barrels of salt mackerel, some of which were taken off that port.

About 100 barrels of fresh mackerel are at Boston today from Nova Scotia.

The fare of sch. Olga sold to George Perkins & Son at \$11 per barrel.

The fare of sch. David Sherman sold to Slade Gorton & Co. at \$11 per bbl. for rimmed and \$10.50 for plain.

Found New Fish.

President David Starr Jordan of the Stanford University has returned from his trip to the Hawaiian Islands, where he has been for the past two months conducting a thorough and detailed study of the fisheries and fishes of the islands under the direction of the United States Fish Commission. About 240 species of fish have thus far been collected and classified, 50 of which are new to science.
