WILD AS HAWKS

Are the Big Mackerel Schools on Southeastern Georges.

SEINERS REPORT PLENTY OF FISH.

But Next to Impossible to Catch Them.

The seiners from Georges this morning have small fares. They report being on fish 130 miles from Highland light, way on the southeast part of the bank. There is any quantity of mackerel, great schools of them, which show at morning and just before sundown. At times 100 schools can be seen from the masthead, but the fish are so wild that it is next to impossible to stop even a barrel of them. Many of the vessels have been setting at them for ten days and have not got 50 barrels of fish. Some of the schools are large and red, but nothing can be done with them.

The skippers, many of them, are having their seines lengthened, but they say it is one chance in a thousand of getting a school of these fish. They think that some day somebody may get a big haul. The fish are so wild, that they will not be so wild, and they will show of getting a fare.

The fare of sch. S. F. Maker sold to the Andrews Co. at \$10.62 1-2 per barrel. Heath's trap has 400 tinkers this morning.

There are 262 barrels of fresh mackerel at Boston from Nova Scotia to-day.

The fare of sch. Kentucky was sold to the Gloucester Mackerel Company for \$10.67 1-2 and \$12.67 1-2 per barrel.
