Both Are Now Catching the Wily, Elusive Mackerel.

NETTERS DOING EXTRA WELL.

Several Seiners Have Fine Fares at Newport Today.

The mackerel horizon is much brighter this morning than for many days past. The netters are eclipsing all former records and the trips they are landing daily at New York are beyond the most sanguine expectations. The seiners have struck fish again off Seaconnet and Brenton Reef lightship and some fine fares are at Newport today in consequence.

Fresh mackerel brought 12 and 9 cents each this morning.

The crew of steamer Alice M. Jacobs made the handsome share of \$192.86 as the result of their southern seining season.

A dispatch from Halifax, N. S., last night says: Mackerel have struck in on this coast in large quantities, and last evening the schooner Globe of Pennant secured 25,000 large fish. Most of them will be iced and shipped to Boston by the Plant liner Halifax tomorrow. A large fleet of American seiners are reported off Halifax.

Although there have been several reports of the appearance of mackerel on the Cape Shore, the most encouraging advices from Nova Scotia water are under date of Saturday.

At Yarmouth the county traps had 35 mackerel on Saturday and on Sunday two loed barrels were taken.

At Lunenburg one boat had eight mackerel, and fish were reported schooling off Canso.

Five mackerel were taken at Louisburg and there were signs of fish at L'Ardoise. Mackerel were scarce at Whitehead.

About 100 mackerel are reported to have been caught in the vicinity of Prospect, and the fishermen on the western shore have launched their seine boats.
