MACKEREL NEWS.

Steamer Alice M. Jacobs Has Fine Fare at Boston.

Several Salt Mackerel Trips at This Port Today.

Since last report there have been six arrivals here with mackerel, one fare being with fresh fish.

Steamer Alice M. Jacobs, Capt. Solomon Jacobs, arrived at Boston last night from Georges with a fine fare of 160 barrels of salt mackerel and 18,000 fresh mackerel in count. Before going to Boston, Capt. Jacobs came in here and landed his seine and then went to Boston to land his fish.

The mackerel market was active this morning. The fares of sch. Albert Geiger sold to the Gloucester Mackerel Company at \$10 75 per barrel, and the fare of sch. Dreadnaught (rimmed and late caught) brought \$12 per barrel from the Andrews Co. The owners seem to be in no hurry to sell and are looking for advances or offers of \$10 58 per barrel. Some of the buyers appear to want fish, and one craft had a \$10 50 offer before she dropped her anchor. The unanimous report of the veining skippers that the Georges spurt is about played out may have something to do with the advance.

Sch. Veda M. McKown arrived this morning from Georges with a fine fare of 300 barrels of salt mackerel.

Sch. Nettie Franklin is at Boston today with 100 barrels of fresh mackerel.

Fresh mackerel started at 12 cents apiece at Boston today.

Latest reports from Georges say that the fleet is divided, one section being to the eastward of the other. The fish are very wild and in small schools.

The fare of schooner Agnes E. Downes sold to the Gloucester Fresh Fish Co. at 9 1-4 cents each.

The fare of sch. Mary E. Harty sold to Wm. H. Jordan & Co.
