The largest fare of bluefish of the year—more than 1000 fish—was landed from the waters south of Nantucket yesterday. The fish are running in very large schools, usually near shore.

**Halibut Sale.**

The fare of sch. Oregon sold to the New England Fish Co. at 9 cts. per pound for white and 3 cents for gray. This is a drop of two cents per pound on gray and a raise of one cent per pound on white, but there are very few white fish in the fares from the northern banks.

William H. Jordan & Co. bought the fare of sch. Agnes E. Downes at \$10.50 for large rimmed fish and \$16 per barrel for tinkers. This price is probably the highest paid for tinkers in the history of the mackerel fishery.
