**TRAWLER'S BIG SHARE.**

Sch. Alice Guthrie's Men Get \$907 in One Year.

VESSEL'S STOCK WAS \$33,000.

This Is Record Share for an Eight-Dory Trawler.

Sch. Alice M. Guthrie, Capt. Martin Guthrie, of this port, sailed on her maiden trip August 12, 1901, and on August 15, 1902, she arrived at Boston. Without counting this last fare, the Guthrie has made a record which has probably never been equalled and certainly never excelled by any eight-dory fishing vessel in the history of the fisheries.

Capt. Guthrie did not keep account of the stock of his craft previous to new year's, but since January 1, 1902, up to and not including this trip, he has stocked \$13,000, and it is estimated that the vessel's stock for a year, lacking one week, was \$33,000. The share of the crew was \$907 to a man. This has probably never been equalled, when six of vessel and crew are considered.

Capt. Guthrie is one of those quiet-going fellows of whom one seldom hears and whose big work is known to but few outside the fishermen and men interested in the fishing business. He made a fine record in sch. Caviere, and last year built the schooner in which he has done such extra good work. He is a capable, energetic man, blessed with good judgment and a willingness to work. He is modest and retiring, and is backed up by one of the smartest crews of trawlers in the business.

**RECORD BREAKER.**

Sch. Norman Fisher Has King of Rips Fares.

Hails for 80,000 Pounds of Salt Cod.

Sch. Norman Fisher, Capt. John Williams, which arrived this morning, has the king of all Rips fares on record, her trip being hailed for 80,000 pounds of salt cod. This fare like all other Rips trips was taken on Georges, drifting, but are still called Rips trips from the fact that when this drift fishing was begun, the fleet used to operate on the Rips grounds.

The fare will net a handsome stock and share and shows that Capt. Williams is a star in his line.
