FOR THE HERRING SEASON.

Men Getting Ready at Bay of Islands and Bonne Bay.

Channel Claimed To Be Good Port of Entry.

Channel, N. F., Sept. 5, 1902.

The fall and winter herring fishing about Bonne Bay and Bay of Islands attracts many fishermen from about St. Johns, and last week several went to the former place to engage in the work of supplying the United States schooners which come there. Others are expected to follow, having been assured by the experience of some who were there last year that there is money in it.

Speaking of the fall and winter herring fishery at Bay of Islands, it is assumable that it would be to the advantage of Gloucester vessels engaged in that business if on their way down they called at Channel and fixed up all their papers. Bondsmen can be procured at a reasonable figure, permission to load herring can be obtained from St. John's in half an hour, the inspector of weights and measures is a resident and can always be at hand to inspect and stamp tubs, and last, but by no means least, there is a Vice Consulate with a competent official in charge.

It stands to reason that vessels calling here will be greatly facilitated in their work and will not suffer from the delay entailed by having to go right up to get through with the customs, thereby losing a great deal of time. Last season four Gloucester skippers fixed up at Channel, and were well pleased to find that they were ever so much ahead. If any doubt about the matter, information may be obtained from Capt. R. D. Terry of sch. Centennial, Capt. Reuben Cameron of sch. Grayling, W. H. Malone of sch. Dreadnaught, and Capt. Eldredge H. Spinney of sch. Hattie E. Nickerman. It is quite probable that these gentlemen are in different vessels this season, but they commanded schooners above given last fall during the herring schools.

Sch. Arcadia baited here yesterday and schs. Arkona and Helen F. Whitten are due today from Sydney.
