**FROM FAR  
UP NORTH.**

**Sch. George Parker Brings  
Fletched Halibut Fare.**

**IS THE FIRST OF THE SEASON.**

**Found Good Fishing at Mouth  
of Davis' Strait.**

Sch. George Parker of Boston, Capt. Albert Flygore, arrived this morning from the far-away northern waters of Davis strait and the Labrador coast with a fine fare, 180,000 pounds of fletched halibut, the largest fletched trip which has been brought in for some few years. She is the first of the fletched halibut fleet to arrive this season.

Capt. Flygore reports that the season in the spring opened very poorly, lots of ice and bad weather handicapping fishing operations. The Parker suffered in one of the gales, losing her cable and being damaged about the stern and was obliged to put back to St. John's, N. F., for a new cable and repairs.

Coming out again on the bank, Capt. Flygore found fish scarce, and worked far to the northward and met with better success, going to the 58th parallel and a little beyond, which is farther north than any of our fishermen have been since the Greenland and Iceland fletched halibut fisheries were abandoned. This brought the craft into the mouth of Davis' strait and on good fishing.

One place was found where the current was very strong, running at the rate of seven miles an hour and taking the trawl buoys right under. A shift was made from here and a spot found where the tide was only three or four miles an hour and here fish were struck, 15 dory loads being taken on the first set, and Capt. Flygore had his patience and judgment rewarded with a big trip.

Just before coming home the Parker spoke the sch. Mystery. She only had 40,000 pounds of fletches, but her skipper, Capt. Forman Lord, who had been stricken blind on the trip, was improving and slowly recovering his sight.

Capt. Flygore reports sch. Edward S. Eveleth with 100,000 pounds and sch. A. E. Whyland with 150,000 pounds. Sch. American he had not seen recently.

The Parker will probably sell her fare in Boston and Capt. Flygore will make a big stock.

**Good Trip.**

A letter received by Capt. Wm. E. Morrissey from his son Clayton, captain of the sch. Harry G. Nickerson, on the banks, states that he had 300,000 lbs. fish on his second trip, thus leading the whole fleet of salt fishermen, half of whom have not yet got any bait to fish with. Capt. Morrissey found the fish out to the north east of the Grand Banks in 90 fathoms of water, and got plenty of squid on the ground. He landed on the first trip 318,000 lbs., and will likely have on this trip 370,000 lbs., which will give him nearly 700,000 lbs. for the season, a record-breaking voyage, sure enough.—Nova Scotia Coast Guard.
