NOW A LUXURY.

Salt Mackerel Sell for \$27 Per Barrel.

Fare of Sch. Navahoe Brought That This Morning.

Salt mackerel took the biggest jump of the season today, and also made the record price of the season, when the fare of sch. Navahoe sold to Frank E. Davis at \$27 per barrel, an advance of \$3 over last sales. This is the highest price for some time, and if mackerel continue to be as scarce as at present, will probably be exceeded before long.

The fish being landed at present go about 135 to 140 to a barrel, so that out of the vessels here a salt mackerel is worth about 20 cents. After going through the wholesaler, middleman and retailer, it is easy to see by the time it reaches the consumer that a salt mackerel is indeed a luxury.

Sch. Theodore Roosevelt Has Fine Halibut Fare.

New England Fish Company Secured the Trip.

Sch. Theodore Roosevelt, Capt. James McHenry, arrived from Grand Bank this morning with a fine fare of 30,000 pounds of halibut and 15,000 pounds of cod. As on yesterday, the halibut were in great demand, and the New England and Atlantic companies bid the fare up in fine style, starting the fish at 12 cents per pound for white and 8 cents for gray, and ending at 15 cents for white and 10 cents for gray at which figures the New England Fish Company secured the trip.

While not as high as yesterday's figures, still it is a fancy price, and Capt. McHenry will make a fine stock.
