TO PROTECT SHELL FISH.

The Eel Considered the Particular Enemy of the Lobster.

The fish and game committee heard W. C. Stoddard of Fairhaven yesterday in favor of a bill to provide that the fish and game commissioners may have \$5000 for preserving and improving the food fishes of our waters, so as to defend the lobster and oyster from its enemies. Mr. Stoddard thinks the eel the particular enemy of the lobster spawn, and the star-fish of the oyster, and he desires to have a bounty offered for the destruction of eels and starfish.
