SERIES OF GALES.

Sch. Priscilla Smith Has Rough Homeward Trip.

Buffeted by a Succession of Blows.

Sch. Priscilla Smith, Capt. William Corkum, arrived this morning after a long, hard passage, bringing the first frozen herring cargo from Placentia Bay this present season.

Capt. Corkum reports that the winter there has been one of unusual severity, and that herring had been scarce. The state of the weather had so discouraged the fishermen that they gave up early, and did but little fishing.

Capt. Corkum says the passage home was a most tempestuous one. After leaving the bay the craft encountered the ice 35 miles east by south from Scattarie, and ploughed about in it for two days, getting clear of it 35 miles south by east of Scattarie.

Since that time the craft encountered two northwesterly, a northeaster, a southeaster and a west-southwester. She was obliged to harbor at Shelburne and came out from there Sunday, taking the southeaster on Monday and having it heavy, running to within 40 miles of Thatchers.

In speaking of the weather at Placentia Bay, Capt. Corkum says that during one gale, the vessel while lying with 90 fathoms of chain out broke the flue of the anchor short off and dragged a mile in one of the reaches before the other anchor bid her up.

IN GRASP OF THE ICE KING.

Revenue Cutter Seminole Ice Bound at Channel, N. F.

TRAIN SERVICE ABANDONED.

The Bruce, 54 Hours Out, May Be Caught in Ice.

According to the latest dispatch from St. John's, N. F., the grasp of an Arctic winter upon the island and adjacent waters is even more firm than ever before.

The unprecedentedly severe weather continues in these latitudes. The United States revenue cutter Seminole, which is on her way to the Bay of Islands to attempt to cut out the ice-bound American fishing schooners, is still herself ice-bound in Channel harbor, and the prospect of her continuing the voyage is worse than ever.

The mail steamer Bruce is 54 hours out trying to cross from Channel to Sydney, a distance of only 90 miles. She is still unreported and it is feared has been caught in the floes.

The steamer Regulus, which arrived here Tuesday morning from Sydney, reports having met with immense bodies of ice in the Gulf of St. Lawrence. The train service across Newfoundland has been virtually abandoned. Trains are blocked in 15 feet of snow, and it is not known when they will escape.
