NETTERS SUNK.

Sch. Ella Oliver, of Portland, Lost Off New York.

Captain and Crew Took to Boats and Were Saved.

The New York harbor inspector's tug Scout, Capt. Nelson, landed at the Battery on Saturday. Capt. Hanson and two sailors composing the crew of the fishing schooner Ella Oliver of Portland, Me., which they were compelled to abandon last Thursday night in a sinking condition.

The crew took their boat and rowed to the Sandy Hook lightship, where they were comfortably quartered until Saturday, when they were taken off by the Scout.

Capt. Hanson said that about 7 o'clock Saturday evening when within 18 miles of the Highlands, a rather heavy cross sea prevailing at the time, his little vessel sprung a leak and within 15 minutes was full of water. The boat was launched and the crew left as the vessel was sinking. They then made for the Sandy Hook lightship, which was safely reached at 10.30 o'clock.

The captain and crew saved nothing but what they stood in.

The Ella Oliver was 12.52 tons gross, 11.90 tons net, built in Georgetown, Me., in 1867, and was owned by Howard Woodbury, and was engaged in mackerel netting.
