## DAMAGED BY ICE FLOE.

### Sch. George Parker Has Hard Time on Funks.

#### AT ST. JOHN'S TO REPAIR.

#### Stern Split and Damage Below Water Line.

Sch. George Parker of Boston, Capt. Albert Flygore, was at St. John's, N. F., recently for an anchor and to make repairs. The Parker is engaged in the flitch-halibut fishery on Bacalieu Bank, and was fishing at about 59 degrees north latitude off the Funks, when about three weeks ago at night, during a heavy snow storm, she was beset by very heavy loose ice and had a hard time of it knocking about among the "growlers," some of which hit her with great force, splitting the stern, starting the planks under the water line and doing other damage, so that it was found necessary to run to St. John's for repairs. She found fish scarce and has about 65,000 lbs. on board. She spoke the schs. Monitor, Margaret and Puritan, the latter commanded by Capt. Flygore's brother, about a week ago and they report fish scarce.

### Four Seiners There Today with Fresh Mackerel.

#### Mackerel Season Over at Magdalene Islands.

Mackerel fishing at the Magdalene Islands is over on account of scarcity of fish and bad weather.

Large numbers of dogfish have appeared in Barnstable Bay and the mackerel dragging fleet is unable to catch any mackerel. The fishermen say the dogfish have come so close inshore as to drive the mackerel many miles out to sea, instead of sending them inshore as in former years. The Green Harbor mackerel fleet has had little luck this season.
