WANTED THE FISH.

Three fares of Rips cod have arrived since last report, two yesterday afternoon, and one, sch. Edward A. Rich, this morning. The dealers were sharp after this latter fare, and lively bidding resulted, Reed & Gamage securing the trip at \$4 per hundred weight for large and \$3.40 for medium. The last previous sales were at \$3.62 1-2 and \$2.87 1-2, so this fare brought an advance of 37 1-2 cents on large and 52 1-2 cents on medium.

THREE GOOD FARES

Of Much Needed Salt Bank Cod Have Arrived.

Sch. Effie M. Morrissey Makes Second Bank Trip.

The first arrivals for some time from the salt bank fleet came today, schs. Lucinda I. Lowell, Effie M. Morrissey and Mabel D. Hines being in and all with good fares.

Sch. Lucinda I. Lowell, Capt. Roderick McNeil, hails for 270,000 pounds, nearly a full trip. D. B. Smith & Co., who own the vessel, will take the fare.

Sch. Effie M. Morrissey, Capt. William Harding, hails for 175,000 pounds, and has been gone only seven weeks. This is the second salt bank trip that Capt. Harding has made this season, being the first of the fleet to do so. Both trips were made in good time and Capt. Harding has ample time to make one long or two short trips before the season is over.

Sch. Mabel D. Hines, Capt. Charles Rudolph, also arrived this morning and has a big trip, something in the neighborhood of 300,000 pounds.

Part of the Morrissey's fare and the whole of the Hines' trip are on the market.

SEINERS GET GOOD HAULS.

Several Fine Fares Are at Newport Today.

CAPT. SOL. JACOBS AT BOSTON.

Some Vessels Made Hauls and Salted.

The good weather of the past two or three days was quite a boom to the seining fleet and as a result there are several fine fares at Newport today and one at Boston.

The fleet are fishing between No Man's Land and the South Shoal lightship and the report from there is that lots of fish have been seen, but they are so wild that it is almost impossible to catch them.

The spring catch of mackerel is now over as far as Nova Scotia is concerned. The result as a whole, is not altogether satisfactory. In some districts exceptionally large catches were secured, but at other places no fish at all were taken. In Chedabucto Bay, at Arichat and in Lennox Passage, and vicinity fully 10,000 barrels were packed, although at one time the catch was rumored to be 25,000 barrels. The price ex-vessel if about \$8. Fishermen on the Halifax and Lunenburg coast are hoping to do better when the summer run of fish comes along.

Fresh mackerel brought 13 cents each at Boston today.

The druggers landed 18 barrels of very large mackerel at Rockport yesterday.

RAISED THE PRICES.

Board of Trade Fisheries Committee Put Them Up.

No Distinction Between Eastern and Western Fresh Cod.

The fisheries committee of the Board of Trade at its weekly meeting this morning made several raises in price on different lines of salt cod. Large handline Georges were jumped 25 cents, from \$3.75 to \$4 and large trawl Georges were moved up from \$3.50 to \$3.75. Large trawl bank was raised from \$2.87 1-2 to \$3 and large handline cod elevated from \$3.12 1-2 to \$3.25 per hundred weight.

The fresh fish committee also had a meeting and raised the price of fresh cod caught to the eastward of Cape Sable to \$2 and \$1.40 per hundred weight for large and medium.

These are the same figures as are quoted by the committee on fresh cod caught to the westward of Cape Sable, so the distinction, in price at least, between the eastern and western caught cod is done away with for the time being at least.

OFF BLOCK ISLAND.

Sch. Marguerite Haskins Makes Monster Haul.

ARRIVED AT NEWPORT TO-DAY.

Has 500 Barrels Fresh and 187 Barrels Salt Mackerel.

One of the banner trips of the year is that which sch. Marguerite Haskins, Capt. Benj. H. Spurling, has at Newport. The craft has 187 barrels of salt mackerel and between 400 and 500 barrels of fresh mackerel. Sch. Victor is also there with 100 barrels of fresh mackerel and 100 barrels of salt mackerel.

For some time it has been reported that there were plenty of mackerel off No Man's Land, but that the schools were so wild that it was impossible to make many hauls. Capt. Spurling reports that he got his fish in shore from where the fleet are fishing and found the fish much tamer and easier to catch.

There is no question but what there is a large body of mackerel out that way, and Capt. Solomon Jacobs of steamer Alice M. Jacobs says that for 30 miles schools can be seen.

A telephone message from Newport this morning says that the Haskins got her fish seven miles off Block Island. The school were not wild, but easier to catch and appeared to be a new run of fish.

As both salt and fresh mackerel are a good price at present, Capt. Spurling will make a big stock, one of the best of the year, probably in the vicinity of \$6000 or better.

A message from Newport states that sch. Hattie M. Graham got around a big school when the Haskins got her fish, but unfortunately burst her seine and lost the fish.

Steamer Halifax brought 1888 barrels of salt Nova Scotia mackerel to Boston yesterday, most of them coming from Port Hawkesbury.

Light mackerel fishing is reported at the Magdalene Islands.

Sch. Monarch was at Newport yesterday with 40 barrels salt mackerel.

The mackerel landed at Portland yesterday were taken off Cape Elizabeth. They weighed about two pounds apiece.

Twenty-two hundred and thirty-five barrels of Irish mackerel are in transit for this country.

Capt. Solomon Jacobs of sch. Alice M. Jacobs reports about 50 sail of seiners on the school off No Man's Land. There were lots of fish, but they were very wild. The Jacobs stocked \$2730 on her fresh mackerel landed at Boston yesterday.
