**Drifted Bergs Threaten To Block-
ade Newfoundland Coast.**

**Belle Isle Strait Choked with
Ice and Bays Frozen.**

A St. John's, N. F., dispatch says that a

bergs are drifting south, threatening to block-

ice and will be compelled to remain until
spring. Within a week navigation will be
closed throughout the eastern seaboard.

WEEKLY FISH MARKET.

As is expected at this time the tone of the
fish market is very quiet although the market
has held up better and longer than last year.
Prices on all grades are firmly maintained but
the smoked, bloater trade has fallen off this
week and it will be quiet in this line until the
middle of January.

All kinds of fish are in very light receipt,
owing mostly to the very severe weather which
has swept the fishing grounds from Cape Cod
to Newfoundland all the week, making fishing
impossible, what few fish are received bring
high prices. No Newfoundland herring have
come this week, but some are expected.

The outlook for a good shipping market for
frozen herring is most encouraging but at
present the news from the base of supply,
Bay of Islands, denotes a scarcity of these de-
sired fish. There has been one arrival from
the Maine coast, the first for years, with a full
cargo of frozen herring and although not equal
to the Newfoundland article they will find a
ready and waiting market.

All grades of cured fish are firm and small
lots of selected fish are bringing an advance
over the market quotations.

The fish receipts this week are almost the
lightest of the year.

The receipts for the week, up to noon today,
Dec. 19, aggregate:

- 50,000 pounds of salt cod.
- 53,000 pounds of fresh cod.
- 10,000 pounds of hake.
- 14,000 pounds of pollock.
- 260 barrels of fresh herring.
- 97,000 lbs. fresh haddock.
- 800 bbis. frozen herring.

**LOST \$2000
IN CASH.**

**Was on Steamer Alice M.

CAPT. JACOB'S MISFORTUNE.

A St. John's, N. F., dispatch of last night
states that steamer Alice M. Jacobs which
went ashore on the rocks at Dolan's Island,
near Cape Ray, will be a total loss. The
crew saved nothing but what they stood in,
barely escaping with their lives. The dis-
patch adds that Capt. Jacobs beside losing
his steamer and outfit, lost about \$2000 in
cash which he had on board.
