fish of the New England coast from the dep-
redations of dogfish is a most timely docu-
ment and one which will meet with the hearty
support of every man who hauls a trawl, as
well as vessel owners, skippers and fish deal-
ers from New York to Newfoundland.

The representative's resolution calls for the
commonwealth of Massachusetts to favor
such legislation as mentioned above and will
undoubtedly be adopted when it comes before
the senate and house.

At that time it is expected that Representa-
tive McIntire will address the house in sup-
port of his resolution and show his fellow
members in his own plain, straightforward
way how not only the shore fisheries but the
fishermen have suffered by the depredations of
dogfish and give them facts and figures to
prove it.

Previous to his election, he made it one of
his strong points that if elected he should labor
that something might be done toward the ex-
tinction of this pest of the seas and destroyer
of food fishes.

Backed up by his thorough knowledge of
the situation, for the representative has been
a fisherman and vessel owner as well as a
careful student of the situation, he is as well
able, and perhaps more so than any other to
bring this matter to the knowledge of the
state authorities and champion the cause in the
legislative halls.

The matter promises to be one of national
importance and will be heard soon at Wash-
ington therefore it is hoped that Massachusetts,
the greatest fishing state in the whole union,
should array itself on the right side and em-
phatically endorse the resolution introduced by
the representative from the largest fishing port
in the country.
