NURSERY FOR NAVY.

Secretary Moody Directed to
Furnish Information.

RELATIVE TO THE FISHERIES.

Senator Hoar Secures Passage of
Important Resolution.

A despatch from Washington says that Senator Hoar introduced and secured the passage of a resolution in the senate yesterday calling upon the secretary of the navy to furnish the senate with such information as he may have at his command relative to the value of the American fisheries, including the Atlantic and Pacific shore and ocean fisheries and of the alces and gulf, as a source for the supply of seamen for the navy in time of war.

Relative to this matter, the Boston Transcript last evening had the following despatch: "This opens the way to a most important inquiry. Henry M. Whitney, the leader of the Canadian reciprocity movement, has intimated in public addresses that the Gloucester fisheries were now of little value as a training school for seamen in the navy, while Senator Hoar in a recent interview on the same subject has said in effect that he would as soon trade off Anapolis as the Gloucester fisheries, as an element of national dignity and national defense.

"The Navy Department can readily compile these figures. Each enlisted man in the navy enters his occupation and it will be possible to see the extent to which the Gloucester fishermen do go into the navy. The officials in charge of the enlistments already have very decided notions on that subject; they stated to the Transcript correspondent a few weeks ago that it was an exploded idea, or should be, that the fisheries were of any great service in this respect. This on the present peace basis.

"Whether the Spanish war conditions were different is not so clear, but unless some way is legitimately found, in responding to this request, of modifying the obvious teaching of present day figures they will prove a boomerang to the cause in whose interest they are apparently sought. While the scope of the inquiry is larger than Gloucester, this has long been the storm center of the controversy."

MORE MACKEREL.

Though the number of bankers will not be quite as large as last year, Lunenburg will still hold her old position. The shipyards are at present taxed to their utmost capacity.

Sailed for Mackerel Netting.

Steamer Joppaite, Capt. Chort, sailed from Newburyport this forenoon for New York, from which port she will make trips out into the bay in search of mackerel. The Joppaite's crew will be composed of Newburyport and Gloucester fishermen of experience.
