The fishermen at Newport were notified yesterday by the officials of the Fall River line, that owing to conditions arising from the freight handlers' strike in New York, it would be impossible for them to take any fish from there to New York last night. It is believed there will be a very large amount of fish on hand by today and considerable loss to the fishing fleet may result.

WEEKLY FISH MARKET.

The fish market presents no new features this week. Trade is very dull and listless but the market is strong and even in some lines shows a slight advance on fish from the vessel. Sales of Rips cod are at 5 cents all around above the Georges handline quotations and a little advance is noted on the last fares of fresh pollock from Provincetown. A few barrels of early southern caught salt mackerel were sold at \$12 per barrel, the opening price last year being \$19.50. Many of the mackerel seining fleet have gone to the Cape Shore, but quite a number will remain south and operate there, as quite a lot of fish were seen before the recent spell of bad weather. Fish this week have been in light receipt.

Sch. Fannie W. Freeman is at Matheson's wharf fitting for a Grand Bank salt cod trip, under command of Capt. James Allen.

The salt cod fish fleet will comprise five sail from this port this year, one of which, sch. Ada K. Damon, will fish in the North Bay. It has been quite a few years since a vessel has been sent from Provincetown to this latter fish ground.

Capt. Herman Mayo, formerly of sch. Little Jennie, recently lost off Monomoy, will command sch. Daniel Boone and will engage in the southern drag fishery.

Sloop Active has stocked \$800 thus far in the southern drag fishery.

Sch. James A. Garfield of Gloucester is at Provincetown taking pollock from the fish traps.

CANADA'S FISHERIES.

Value of Catch of 1903 Was Almost \$22,000,000.

The total value of fish and fish products of the Dominion of Canada for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1903, aggregated \$21,959,433, according to a report forwarded to the department of commerce and labor by United States Counsel Berphoiz, at Three Rivers. The value of these products from the various provinces was as follows: Nova Scotia, \$7,351,753; British Columbia, \$5,284,824; Quebec, \$2,059,175; New Brunswick, \$3,912,514; Ontario, \$1,265,706; Manitoba and Northwest territory, \$1,198,437; Prince Edward Island, \$887,024. The yield for the season for 1901-02 exceeded that of the present season by \$3,777,720.

During the fiscal year the value of fish and fish products as well as marine animals, exported to Canada from foreign countries was \$11,826,646.
