

REMARKABLE RECORD.

Sloop Helen M. Lane Makes Big Hauls Down East.

ROLLS UP STOCK OF \$3500.

Only Eighteen Days Fishing Off Boothbay Harbor.

Some little while ago, news was received from Boothbay that codfish had been taken in goodly amounts off Cuckolds, near that port, and now comes to hand a confirmation of that news, in the shape of the wonderful record of a Rockport sloop which was "on the spot" and profited thereby, the sloop Helen M. Lane, Capt. Lane, who resides in Rockport and carries a Rockport crew. It was this craft which struck the cream of the fishing there.

The Lane left Rockport with her nets and crew of three men, outside the captain and went to the eastward. How well she did on the big school of fish there is best told by the fact that in 18 days work they landed at Boothbay 200,000 pounds of fresh cod, which sold at \$1.75 per hundred weight, making a stock of \$3500, a record unequalled by a shore fishing sloop in that length of time.

The catches were made two miles west of the Cuckolds, and the Lane is still there reaping the harvest of the unexpected run of fish. Since the Lane began to do so well, other Cape Ann boats have gone there and several parties from down east have been here to purchase nets and pursue the same line of fishing.

NEW LOBSTER LAW.

Ways and Means Committee Report Favorably.

In the House the ways and means committee reported in favor of the resolve calling for a state appropriation for the purchase of egg-bearing lobsters by the fish and game commission. This resolve is the outcome of two petitions introduced by Representatives Davis of Salem and Tarr of Rockport and has already passed the senate. It calls for the expenditure this year of \$7000 and \$5000 a year hereafter. The extra amount this year is for the purchase of a steam launch and other apparatus with which to get the work in running order.

DOGFISH PLENTY.

Cap. Alfred Johnson Found Them Solid on Georges.

Capt. Alfred Johnson of sch. Lella E. Norwood, which arrived from a Georges halibut-trip this morning, reports that he never encountered more dogfish than on this trip. The pests would be found on almost every hook when the trawls were hauled and fairly broke up the trip, as Capt. Johnson says that but for them he would have secured a fine fare. Capt. Johnson is a firm believer that something should be done to try to exterminate these pests.



FROM THE CAPE SHORE.

Good News Received from the Seiners Today.

HAULS MADE OFF SAMBRO.

Fish Reported Plenty but Weather Not Good.



Good news came from the Cape Shore seining fleet yesterday afternoon in the shape of a telegram from Halifax to the Boston Fish Bureau. The message stated that some of the fleet were in there for harbor and that some had taken fish off Sambro on Thursday. The Monitor and Diana made hauls of about 200 barrels each, the Natalie J. Nelson about 115 barrels, the Constellation 60 barrels each, Bertha and Pearl 40 barrels and the Corsair a small school. The captains reported plenty of mackerel but they were hindered in their operations by bad weather.

Advices received here state that heavy catches are now being made on the Irish coast.

WEEKLY FISH MARKET.

Undisputably dull has been the fish trade the past week. Both consignments and orders have been light. Prices have been well sustained, there being no change in Board of Trade prices. The only drop has been made on Rips cod, which for a time sold at more than headline Georges figures and on last sales were scaled down to \$4 for large and \$3.30 for mediums. The mackerel seiners have done little this week, but lots of fish are now reported off Seaconnet, but they are very wild. Some good hauls have been made on the Cape Shore, where a good body of fish has been reported, but the fleet there is meeting with bad weather. Receipts of fish have been fair, salt and fresh cod being the leaders.

Provincetown Fishermen Making Fine Shares.

Provincetown's toilers of the sea have been favorites of fortune of late. The crew of sch Rose Cabral, trawler, earned \$71 per man in five days. Sch. Philip Manta's men shared \$44 each for three day's work, and have earned \$440 each since January. Last year her crew earned \$889 each. One of the masters cleaned up \$3000 last season, though, as he owned a commanding part of his craft, its earnings are included in the amount named. Sch. Active has averaged over \$50 per man per week since leaving home a month ago, with the cream of the season's work before her.
