The fare of sch. Bertha and Pearl sold to Slade Gorton & Co. at \$12.75 per barrel.
 Sch. F. W. Homans of this port was at Port Mulgrave Wednesday and shipped home 207 barrels of salt mackerel.
 Sch. Mabel Bryson, 12 bbls. fresh mackerel, 92 swordfish.
 Some mackerel were caught at Louisburg, Tuesday.
 Tinker mackerel have struck at Harpswell and are being caught in large numbers, but yesterday saw the first fare to be landed at Portland. This was brought up by P. C. Alexander of Harpswell, and was sold to the J. W. Trefethen Company, Commercial wharf. The fare amounted to about 1500 pounds.
 The fleet of netters which went out Thursday found a few mackerel and several small fares are reported. They are not very plentiful outside, however.
 At Boston this morning is sch. Veda M. McKown, Capt. Benj. Spurling, with 12,000 fresh mackerel. The little sch. Mabel Bryson is also there with 92 swordfish and 12 barrels of fresh mackerel.

WEEKLY FISH MARKET.

Trade is practically at a standstill. No changes in prices are noted, except on mackerel, on which there has been a good raise of \$1.25 per barrel. Fish are in good receipt generally, although mackerel and salt bank cod are not coming along as freely as is desired. Only two salt bankers have arrived this week and they have not had large fares. As was the case last year, the lack of bait is seriously bothering this fleet. The seining fleet is now operating on Georges where there has been much fog, and the fish are wild. Shack, especially hake and cusk, are coming along freely.

Provincetown Haddockers Doing Well.

Provincetown's haddock fleet has rolled up a fat aggregate stock the past six months and good success is still attending the prosecution of the work. Some capital crew shares are reported as having been earned on one-week-long trips ending within the past four days. The men of sch. Rosie Cabral and sch. Sea Fox shared \$30 on their latest trip; men on sch. Annie Perry \$36, the crew of sch. William A. Morse \$62 each.

These earnings on trips lasting only one week or less would be accounted large ordinarily, but they pale into insignificance almost as compared with the record-breaking crew share that has fallen to the men of sch. Philip P. Manta the present week, \$105.60, won on a trip that lasted only five days from port to port the biggest crew share known in the fresh cod and haddock fishery for a voyage of such short duration. To date, the men of sch. Rose Cabral and sch. Annie Perry have earned over \$500 each, those on sch. Sea Fox upward of \$400, while sch. Manta has already stocked \$20,000 and each man of her crew has received \$655 as his portion of the profits.

FISHERY QUESTION SETTLED.

Compromise Reached Between British and Newfoundland Government.

A cable from London yesterday, says it is announced that an agreement has been reached between the British and Newfoundland governments regarding the fishery regulations under the provisions of the Anglo-French colonial treaty.

The final draft of these regulations, it is expected, will be signed by Premier Bond on behalf of Newfoundland.

The regulations constitute a compromise between the provisions enforced over the North sea fisheries and those now imposed by the Newfoundland government.

Big Mackerel and Large Lobster.

Shattuck & Jones, down in Faneuil Hall market, Boston, are exhibiting a mackerel recently brought in, that tips the scales at 6 1-4 pounds and is 23 inches (nearly two feet) long. This is said to be the biggest mackerel ever caught in this vicinity. The firm also takes pleasure in showing their friends a lobster—just a plain, common lobster, caught in Dorchester Bay,—only it is three feet long, and weighs 23 pounds. Just a trifle bigger than your everyday lobster! Shattuck & Jones originally paid one dollar for this big fellow and I understand that they have been offered \$500 for it.
