HERRING NEWS.

Twelve of the Fleet Yet Remain To Arrive.

Very Poor Outlook at Fortune and Placentia Bays.

At this time 12 of the frozen herring fleet remain to arrive, schs. Hattie M. Graham, American, Arabia, Annie M. Parker, Electric Flash, A. M. Nicholson, Veda M. McKown, Maggie and May, Lena and Maud, Arbitrator, Admiral Dewey and Columbia.

The first three named crafts are on the way from Bay of Islands with cargoes of frozen herring, while the others are at Fortune Bay waiting for cargoes.

Sch. Levi H. Giles is still frozen in the ice at the Humber Arm, Bay of Islands, and it is now believed that she will not be able to get out before the ice breaks up in the spring.

Herring are going well at New York, but trade at Boston is slow. Many cargoes are now here, sold to Boston, waiting their turn to go to that port to take out.

A recent despatch from Placentia Bay reports no herring there. No encouraging reports have been received from Fortune Bay. At last accounts, sch. Admiral Dewey had 500 barrels and schs. Veda M. McKown and A. M. Nicholson between them had 400 barrels. As far as known the other vessels there had little or no herring and there is every indication that the season there will be an utter failure.

Recent news from the Bay of Islands states that the weather is still stormy there and herring remain plentiful. All the fishermen have gone home and all the vessels have gone except Sch. Lewis H. Giles, which is still fast in the ice and will probably not get out until spring. The season has been a most successful one, and it is estimated that 120,000 barrels of herring have been taken out of the bay. In spite of this enormous catch the herring still remain plentiful.

Sch. Cosmopolitan is at this port from Boothbay Harbor this morning with a cargo of frozen herring for John Nagle & Co.

Sch. Blanche will probably go to New York with her cargo of frozen herring.
