### DIED AT SEA.

#### Michael Campbell of Sch. Senator Was Ill But Few Days.

A despatch from Halifax yesterday afternoon states that sch. Senator of this port had arrived at that port with the body of Michael Campbell, one of her crew, who died on board the vessel on March 15, after a few days' illness. Campbell was 60 years old and a native of Bras d'Or, C. B.

Campbell was one of the best known of the older fishermen sailing from this port, having followed the fisheries from here for many years. He resided at 41 Mansfield street, where he leaves a widow, a son, Mr. Alexander Campbell and a daughter, Miss Josie Campbell.

The Senator, which sailed from this port March 6 has on board 10,000 pounds of halibut, which will be transhipped here.

### WHALES IN CAPE COD BAY.

#### Herd of Finbacks Seen by Fishing Boats.

A herd of at least a dozen finback whales are in Cape Cod bay and were reported by several Provincetown fishermen on Friday. Capt. Herman Mayo of the boat Little Jennie says he saw at least one dozen blowing at the same moment. The whales show from Race Point clear to the edge of the ice floe off Dennis, and it is supposed they have come from off shore in pursuit of herring.

### Big Fresh Fish Fares.

There are several big fresh fish fares at Boston and this port today. Sch. Ella M. Goodwin, Capt. James Goodwin, of this port, has the banner fare, 120,000 pounds of fresh fish and 3000 pounds of halibut.

At Boston, sch. Monarch, Capt. Griffin, of this port has 110,000 pounds of fresh fish and sch. Slade Gorton, Capt. George E. Heckman, has 100,000 pounds. Several vessels have from 60,000 to 90,000 pounds.

### Fish Figures.

The report of the U. S. Bureau of Fisheries for the month of February shows that there were landed at this port 1,200,729 pounds of fresh fish, valued at \$44,270. and 96,702 pounds of salt fish, valued at \$3,919. At Boston for the same month there were landed 5,607,300 pounds of fresh fish, valued at \$153,386.

### SEINING FOR CODFISH.

#### Capt. Alden Geel Will Go Again This Spring.

#### Will Fit the Big Sch. Tattler For His Trip.

Capt. Alden Geel will, in about two weeks, begin to fit sch. Tattler for a codfish seining trip to the grounds in the vicinity of Sable Island.

Last season Capt. Geel went on the same kind of a trip in the sch. Maxine Elliott, that being the first trip of the kind ever engaged in from any United States port.

This bold experiment of Capt. Geel proved a success as far as the working and practicability of the project was concerned and this encourages the captain to try it again this spring.

**SIXTEEN VESSELS ASHORE.**

**Ice Drove Them on Flats in Provincetown Harbor.**

**Considerable Difficulty May Be Met in Floating Some.**

The Cape Cod bay ice field, which has been lingering along the east shore for two weeks, was suddenly pushed into Provincetown harbor yesterday forenoon by the northeast gale, and, catching 16 fishing vessels in its grasp, drove them ashore in a tangled bunch at the northwest side of the harbor.

The entire harbor was cleared of vessels with the exception of the tug Peter B. Bradley, which managed to push through the field, although she had a hole stove in her bow at the waterline. She was saved from sinking by emptying her forward water tank, and later patching the hole.]

The vessels driven ashore were schs. Joseph P. Johnson, Annie Perry, Marshall L. Adams, Louisa Cabral, Louisa R. Silva, William A. Morse, Frances V. Silva, Sea Fox, Esther Gray, Fanny Freeman, all of Provincetown; M. S. Ayer, Mary Cabral, Fish Hawk and Bertha M. Bailey of Boston, and sloops Lear C. and Bessie of Provincetown.

Schs. Joseph P. Johnson, William A. Morse, Bertha M. Bailey and Mary Cabral are the furthest up on the beach, being almost on the street at the west end of the town. As all the vessels went ashore at high tide on the spring course of high tides, it is feared that the four mentioned will have considerable difficulty in getting afloat again.

While all the vessels are resting on soft mud bottom, a number are in such a bad jumble that a shift of wind to the southeast would cause many collisions and considerable damage.

**COLLIDED ON GEORGES.**

**Sch. Mooanam Arrives at Boston Minus Mainboom.**

The fishing schooner Mooanam, Capt. Hugh Quinlan, arrived at T wharf, Boston, yesterday, minus her mainboom, which had been carried away in collision with an unknown fishing vessel on Georges Bank last Wednesday. The vessels came together in the night, and both narrowly escaped serious damage. The unknown vessel sustained no apparent injury. The Mooanam brought in 55,000 pounds of haddock, 17,000 pounds of cod and 300 pounds of halibut.

**Claims \$4000 Salvage.**

Capt. Jason Daly of the Boston fishing sch. Muriel, which picked up the disabled fishing sch. Onata and towed her to Pabnico, N. S., and which was recently towed to this port by tug Underwriter for repairs, etc., has made a claim for \$4000 for salvage and placed the matter in the hands of the Admiralty Court at Halifax, N. S., for adjudication.
