Iceland Cod Fishery.

The season of Iceland cod fishery from the port of Paimpol has terminated. The 47 ships of the fleet took 1,600,000 cod, an average of 34,000 against 54,000 in 1904, and the size of the fish was inferior. The decrease in the number captured is attributed partly to the foul weather and partly to the ravages of steam trawlers.

Had No Codfish.

Sunday the fishing schooner Aloha made Gloucester harbor with 300,000 pounds of salted codfish from the grand banks. On the same day the yacht Aloha winged her way into New York harbor, after a cruise along the coast of Scotland, without a single codfish to her credit.—Boston Globe.

HERRING TOO SMALL.

So Sch. Shenandoah Gave Up Herring Trip on Maine Coast.

Sch. Shenandoah, Capt. James C. Gannon, which sailed for the Maine coast for a trip of herring, and which returned a few days ago, as previously reported in the TIMES, met with a little trouble on the coast there, in regard to the state laws regulating the fishing for herring.

Capt. Gannon took his craft down in the vicinity of Portland and proceeded to put out his nets. He found the herring there were very scarce and at once made up his mind that it was no use to stay there and fish as the herring were not of the size which would bring a good figure here, so he was getting ready to return to this port.

At this time he was visited by one of the fish deputies, who notified him that the law there was very exact in regard to the size of nets used and that his nets were too small mesh to use and naturally ordered him not to use them. The order, was, however, superfluous, as Capt. Gannon was not after small herring and had made up his mind to return here and fit for a trip to Ipswich river.

Large Herring Struck.

Large herring struck in at Ipswich river Saturday night for the first time this season. It was too rough for the torchers to do much, but the big gasolene boat Bryda F., Capt. Albert Sadler, owned by Frank Stanwood of this city, took 130 barrels, which were brought over and put in Mr. Stanwood's big freezer. The steamer Pet also took 65 barrels and brought them to this port.

Mackerel on Trawl.

Sch. Emily Cooney, which arrived at Boston this morning, reports catching a large mackerel on one of her trawls on Middle Bank yesterday.

Another Dogfish Factory.

The government dogfish factory at Shippegan, N. B., started up last week with a full supply of fish. It has not yet been determined whether the oil secured by the reduction process will have a marketable value, but there is no question regarding the marketing of the fertilizer.

Bait Gave Out.

The crew of the sch. Uranus, of the Lunenburg, N. S., fleet, made a record recently when they caught 100 quintals of fish in one day and were compelled to stop owing to their running out of bait and salt.

COMING TO SYDNEY.

Lots of Newfoundland Fishermen There To Ship on American Craft.

A North Sydney, C. B., dispatch of last Thursday says:

"About 60 Newfoundland fishermen came up on the Bruce this morning to ship on American fishing vessels which are to engage in the herring fishing industry in Newfoundland waters this fall. The men are being signed by United States Consul West, who came down from Sydney this morning for this purpose.

"Most of the American fishing vessels are taking out licenses to fish in Canadian waters."

Torchers Made Big Catches.

The torchers in Ipswich river made their first large haul of big herring last night, and this morning brought here 300 barrels of the finest kind of bait. The fish are selling at from \$2.50 to \$3 per barrel.
