HEAVY GALE.

Swept Newfoundland Coast Sunday Night.

A despatch from St. John's, N. F., says that a fierce gale swept the coast Sunday night compelling all shipping to remain in harbor during the day. Three disasters are reported and a number of American herring vessels were forced to shelter in harbors at Bay of Islands.

FOUND HERRING SCARCE.

Bay of Island People Not Looking for Big Run.

Capt. Jerome McDonald Talked with the Old Exp. rts.

Capt. Jerome McDonald, who has been at Bay of Islands, N. F., studying the situation there, and who left there a week ago today, is not very strongly impressed with the prospect of securing a cargo of herring, and has decided not to send a vessel there for a frozen cargo.

Capt. McDonald says there would be no trouble in securing a cargo if the herring were there, for the American vessels, while he was there, did as well catching their own fish as did the Nova Scotia vessels which were buying them, and showed that when it came to herring fishing the American dories were "in it" with the native boats.

He talked with many of the natives, the older men, who watch the signs from year to year and know the ways of herring as they know the road to their own houses, and all agreed that the outlook was poor for a good run of herring. He talked with the old custom house officer, a man of 50 years of experience, who said that from the action of the herring when they struck the coast farther up, he did not look for a big strike in Bay of Islands.

Capt. McDonald also had a talk with most of the American captains there, and while they were all hustling to get loads, they were fearful that the expected run might not come. Still, as they all said, a day might change the looks of things, for when the herring came, they came with a rush. They had found no trouble in fishing and despite the scarcity, had done as well catching their herring as had the Nova Scotia vessels which were buying from the native boats.

Mackerel Note.

The fall mackerel fishery on that section of the coast from Aspy Bay to Fouchie was almost a failure. Mackerel from the North Bay and Magdalen Islands appear to have passed along the Inverness coast through the Strait of Canso and South along the Guysboro shore.

HERRING NEWS.

Dec. 2

Items of Much Interest from the Western Star.

Tells of Vessels Loading and the Recent Storm.

From that bright little sheet, the Bay of Islands Western Star of last Wednesday, we clip the following items which we know will be of interest to our readers:

"Since last report there has been little better fishing in the bay, but it has been chiefly confined to Middle Arm, where good fares were secured the latter part of the week. One American vessel with ten dories caught 32 barrels in two days. Other vessels fare equally as well and the industry put on its wonted activity.

"The American vessels sch. Tattler, with 2300 bbls. in bulk and 200 in barrels, and sch. H. M. Stanley with 1600 barrels, 150 of which were barreled, sailed on Sunday. Schs. Jennie B. Hodgdon and Corsair finished loading on Monday. Sch. Golden Rod with 1150 barrels frozen fish and 175 barrels in bulk, will load today. Sch. Edna W. Hopper had 1100 bbls. on Saturday, sch. Parthia 800, and sch. Ralph F. Hodgdon with five dories had 600 bbls. There are 33 American vessels here, and 14 Lunenburgers.

"Sch. A. E. Whyland left Gloucester on Monday of last week, and the W. E. Morrissey on Wednesday. Mr. F. Beazley informs us that he dispatched sch. Laurel to Halifax yesterday with a cargo of 1575 barrels, 1400 of which were in bulk."

Sch. Tattler Hove Down.

"Sch. Tattler when coming out of Middle Arm Saturday had a narrow escape. A squall of wind struck her at 7.30 p. m., causing her to heel over so that it was feared she would never come up again, and water poured down the cabin. There were a great many men on the vessel and excitement ran high for a while."
