TWO SEINERS AT NEWPORT

Struck Large Mackerel Off Montauk Point.

BOTH MADE GOOD HAULS

Schs. Kentucky and Natalie B. Nickerson the Lucky Crafts.

Sch. Kentucky, Capt. Joseph Smith, arrived at Newport during the night with 10,000 large fresh mackerel. The fish were shipped to Boston by express so as to be on the market there this morning. It is understood they brought 22 cents each.

Quite a number of the seining fleet could be seen off here yesterday afternoon and they acted as if they had seen some fish.

A despatch to the Times this noon from Newport states that sch. Kentucky which arrived there this morning, hailing for 10,000 large fresh mackerel in count, had 175 barrels. The same despatch states that sch. Natalie B. Nickerson, Capt. John S. Seavey, arrived this forenoon with 150 barrels of large fresh mackerel. This will net both vessels fine stocks and will put Capt. Seavey pretty near up, if not in the high line place.

Heath's trap at Kettle Island took 400 mackerel this morning. They sold to W. F. Dennett at 26 cents each for large and five cents each for small.

FISHED OFF SABLE ISLAND

Sch. Tattler and Lucinda I. Lowell Secured Fine Fares.

Absent Two Months Taking Ground Fish with Seine.

Sch. Tattler, Capt. Alden C. Geel, and sch. Lucinda I. Lowell, Capt. Thomas M. Denham, are at this port today from salt pollocking seining trips, the former having about 355,000 pounds and the latter 250,000 pounds of fish.

The crafts have been absent some eight weeks and both captains reports bad weather. The vessels are the only two from this port to engage in taking ground fish with a seine and the trips have been a success.

Both skippers have fished off Sable Island, Capt. Geel taking his splendid trip on the ground in 16 days. Capt.
