### THREE TRIPS IN,

#### Mackerel Showed in Small Schools on Middle Bank.

#### Some of the Fleet Made Small Hauls and Probably Salted.

Sch. Alert, Capt. John F. Vautier, arrived at this port early this morning with 20,000 fresh mackerel in count, taken on Middle Bank yesterday. The fish are mediums and sold to the Gloucester Fresh Fish Co., at 5 1-2 cents each.

Sch. Saladin, Capt. Flar McKown, arrived at Boston this forenoon with 10,000 fresh medium mackerel. The fish were taken yesterday on Middle Bank.

The little steamer Elthier is also at Boston this morning with 6000 fresh medium mackerel, taken on Middle Bank yesterday.

The crew of the Alert report that about 35 sail of the fleet were on Middle Bank yesterday. Besides themselves and sch. Saladin, they report that schs. Veda M. McKown, Esperanto and Ralph L. Hall got hauls. Many vessels had their boats out and the fish showed in small schools. It is thought that several of the fleet got small hauls and salted their fish.

Some of the fresh medium mackerel which were held over in the vessels at T wharf, Boston, until yesterday brought six cents each in the morning, whereas on Monday afternoon they declined four cents. Those who held over won out by so doing.

The salt mackerel fare of sch. Helen G. Wells sold to Fred Bradley at \$20 per barrel for large, \$15 per barrel for medium and \$6 for spikes.

Several seiners with their boats out could be seen only a few miles off the mouth of the harbor last evening just before sundown.
