Two Gloucester Seiners Have Taken Some Fish There.

Salt Mackerel Brought Fancy Figures Yesterday.

A letter from North Bay yesterday, reports sch. Lewis H. Giles of this port as having taken 50 barrels of mackerel thus far there, and another letter speaks of sch. Diana as having taken 65 barrels. None of the other vessels were mentioned.

The little steamer Kearsarge is at Boston this morning with 5000 fresh tinker mackerel taken off here.

Mackerel are still being taken on the Nova Scotia coast, and yesterday 34 barrels of large fish were received at Boston from there. The fish brought 20 cents each.

Mackerel have struck in at Essex river and day before yesterday 400 fair-sized fish were taken on the hook. Quite a number are enjoying the sport.

The fare of salt mackerel of sch. Indiana sold to George Perkins & Son-at \$25 per barrel for large and \$20 per barrel for mediums.

WORST FOR 20 YEARS.

Labrador Cod Fishery Is a Bad Failure This Year.

A despatch from St. John's, N. F. says that the Labrador mail reports that the fishing off Labrador is the worst this season in 20 years; American halibut fishing vessels have fared badly. Owing to the failure of the Labrador catch and the short catch along the Newfoundland coast the price of fish is advancing rapidly. It is now \$6 per hundred weight, and the autumn prices are likely to be the highest in many years.
