A letter to the Times from Skibbereen, Ireland, dated August 11, states that at present the mackerel fishery is over there, but will begin again in about three weeks. The spring catch amounted to about 15,000 barrels and about 3000 barrels are still unshipped.

MORE THAN EXPECTED.

Sch. Alert Counted Out 44,000 Fresh Mackerel Yesterday.

Craft Is Now High Line with Stock of About \$13,000.

Sch. Alert, Capt. John F. Vautier, which was at Boston with a large trip of fresh mackerel yesterday, had even more fish than she hailed for, counting out just 44,000 mackerel in number. This will give her a stock of about \$3500, which makes her season's stock thus far about \$13,000, making her high line of the fleet at the present time. Capt. Vautier is right in it this season. He has a fine vessel and a splendid crew and is certainly doing a grand hustle.

The fare of sch. William H. Cross sold to Gorton-Pew Fisheries Co. at \$20 per barrel for mediums and \$9.50 per barrel for tinkers.

The fare of sch. Catherine G. Howard sold to William H. Jordan & Co. at \$26.50 per barrel for large rimmed and \$20 per barrel for mediums.

The fare of sch. Elizabeth Silsbee sold to George Perkins & Son.

The fare of sch. Victor sold to Davis Bros. at \$20 per barrel for mediums and \$10 per barrel for tinkers, a raise of 50 cents per barrel on the latter fish, which went 400 to 440 count per barrel.

The people on the shores of St. Margaret's Bay, N. S., are feeling the benefit of the season's good catch, which has been the best for ten years. On both sides and in every fishing village, fish have been taken; in fact, on the whole shore from Blanford to Prospect. Unlike other years, when some men would make large catches and the many got few, all have shared in the good luck, traps taking from 50 to 30 barrels each, net fishing being good, and the end not yet. The coopers also are happy, for a good fishing season means a brisk demand for barrels.

A letter to Capt. Thomas Hodge from Capt. Gilbert Gallant of sch. F. W. Homans, now in North Bay on a mackerel trip, reports the prospects excellent for a trip. There seems to be quite a lot of mackerel and the fish are schooling on Bank Bradley. The last few days had been bad weather, with some fog, but as soon as it clears up they are confident of getting good fishing.

Some of the netters are beginning to strike mackerel off here again and yesterday four of them were in with fares, selling to W. E. Demmett. Sloop Gardner Heath had 230 fish, sloop Thistle 70, sloop Nautilus 200, and sch. Marv E. Webb 80.

Good Trips.

Sch. Eglantine, Capt. Oscar Benson, arrived from a quick Georges halibuting trip this morning, with a fine fare of 22,000 pounds of halibut, 15,000 pounds of salt cod and 50,000 pounds of fresh fish. Capt. Benson is a auster and as usual is doing well.

Sch. Niagara, Capt. August Swinson, arrived from a short Georges halibuting trip last evening with a fine fare of 30,000 pounds of halibut and 14,000 pounds of salt cod.

Sch. Jubilee, Capt. Oscar Lyons, arrived from a Georges drift trip yesterday afternoon, with one of the best fares of the season, having 60,000 pounds of salt cod. Capt. Lyons has landed about 230,000 pounds of salt cod in five trips thus far this season and is credited with being high line of the "drift" fleet.

SCH. JOSEPH ROSS IN.

Reached Anacortes Yesterday with 850,000 Pounds Cod.

Her Crew of 20 Men All Well-known Gloucester Fishermen.

A telegram to Capt. George A. Johnson, the well known Duncan street fishermen's outfitter, from the Robinson Fisheries Co. of Anacortes, Washington, states that the concern's other banker, sch. Joseph Ross, arrived yesterday with 850,000 pounds of salt cod.

Like the Alice, which arrived last Friday, the Russ is a large vessel and is manned by Gloucester fishermen, who to the number of 40 were shipped here last February by Capt. Johnson for the Robinson Fisheries Co., and left here for Anacortes on March 2. Twenty of them went on the Alice, which carried 20 single dories, and the other 20 went on the Russ, which also carries 20 single dories. They were the only fishermen on both these vessels, but each craft carried a gang of men to dress the fish caught by the Gloucester men, who just fished all the time and had no hand in the dressing and care of the fish.

The despatch states that there were no accidents and that all hands are well. The trip is a big one and the men will no doubt profit accordingly.

The news that the Russ was in was quickly learned by some of the fishermen this morning, and during the forenoon Capt. Johnson says he could have easily shipped 25 good men to go out there and join the 40 now there.

Porto Rico Fish Markets.

In reference to the San Juan, Porto Rico, market for fish stuffs, S. Ramirez & Co., under date of Aug. 7 write: "Since July 31 the following arrivals or fishstuffs have been recorded: At San Juan—Str. Coamo from New York, 75 tes. codfish; British sch. W. E. Stowe from Lunenburg, 272 tes., 50 drs., 75 bxs. codfish. At Ponce—British sch. Ich Dien from Lunenburg, 435 tes., 100 drs. codfish; str. Coamo from New York, 15 tes. codfish. Prior to these arrivals supplies of superior fish in this market were almost exhausted and values had gradually advanced so that sales were made at the equivalent of net ex-wharf. Medium codfish, \$6 per 100 lbs. We quote besides pollock, \$3.50 per 100 lbs.; haddock, \$3.25 do.; split herring, \$6.25 per bbl.; smoked herring, 8 to 9c. per box, lengthwise; medium scaled unsalable at present."
