### MORE FLITCHERS HOME.

#### Only Two More of the Fleet Now Remain to Arrive.

Two more of the flitched halibut fleet have arrived since Saturday, sch. Smuggler, Capt. Joseph Bonia, having 90,000 flitches and a few salt cod, and sch. Dora A. Lawson, Capt. John Marshall, with 85,000 flitches, and a few salt cod. These are fair trips and better than the fares of last season.

The Lawson had her flag at half mast for the supposed loss of Charles Malmberg and Patrick Manahan, but it was hauled down when Capt. Marshall was told that they had been picked up.

But two of the flitched halibut fleet now remain to arrive, schs. Pinta and Arbutus, and they are expected soon.

### WORST FOR YEARS.

#### Terrible Storm Swept Newfoundland and Labrador Coast.

#### Eighteen Vessels Lost and Worse Disaster Feared.

A St. John's, N. F., despatch of yesterday says: Besides 11 schooners wrecked at Belle Isle recently by storms, seven others with more than 100 persons on board were driven ashore on the Labrador coast. Four fatalities only are reported thus far.

It is feared worse disasters occurred on the northern part of the coast, word from which is yet to be received.

More than 250 castaways are now awaiting the arrival of a government steamer to convey them home.

This is the worst disaster since 1886, when 868 fisher folk were made destitute by a single storm, and it required a steamer to return them home.

### BIG ADVANCE.

#### Fresh Hake and Fresh Cusk Boosted in Great Shape.

There was some lively bidding this morning on the fare of fresh fish of sch. Ella M. Goodwin, which came in late yesterday afternoon with a big trip, about 135,000 pounds, mostly hake and cusk. These two kinds of fish were the object of the bidding, which started when the fare was placed on the market. The last previous sales of these fish were \$1.05 per hundred weight for hake and \$1.50 for cusk. The principal bidders were the Gorton-Pew Fisheries Co. and Davis Bros. and the fare was finally secured by Davis Bros. at \$1.30 for hake and \$1.65 for cusk.

**MORE LOSSES.**

**Seven More Vessels and Five Deaths Added to Newfoundland Calamity.**

A St. John's, N. F., dispatch of yesterday says:  
 "Five deaths and seven vessels were today added to the list of deaths and wrecks due to the recent gale which swept the coast of Labrador."  
 "The steamer Portia, which went to Belle Isle to the rescue of 140 castaways from 11 vessels driven ashore there, was unable to effect a landing. It will probably be several days before the castaways can be reached."  
 "Meanwhile the Portia has gone to the coast of Labrador to remove a number of persons who reached there from the wrecked crafts."

**OFF RACE POINT.**

**Sch. Helen G. Wells Got Haul of Medium Mackerel.**

Three Other Vessels There at Time Also Took Fish.

Sch. Helen G. Wells, Capt. Lemuel Firth, arrived here this morning from off Race Point, with 7000 fresh medium mackerel. The fish were taken yesterday in three schools and Capt. Firth reports that sch. Avalon and Marguerite Haskins also got small hauls. Sch. Electric Flash got the largest haul of the day, about 40 barrels, and salted her catch. Sch. Helen G. Wells only sailed from here Monday noon, so she got her catch in short order. Capt. Firth has done well for a new and young skipper, considering that the season has been such a poor one all around.

**Struck Good Herring Fishing.**

Some of the launches found herring in goodly quantities last night and this morning five of them are here with 100 barrels of fine large fish, which will go for bait and to be salted. Two of the launches came from Newburyport and three from up the shore to the westward.
