FOR FISH CLEANING.

Inventor of Famous Iron Chink To Visit This Coast.

IS NAMED CLINTONIA.

Nova Scotia's Finest Fishing Vessel Launched at Lunenburg.

At Lunenburg, N. S. last week a fine new schooner named Clintonia, was launched from the shipyard of Smith & Rhuland, the craft being owned by W. C. Smith of that town.

The Clintonia is said to be the finest fishing vessel owned in Canada, as well as the only one of her type. She was designed by T. M. McMannus of Boston, and named after Gloucester's famous craft owned by Orlando Merchant. Her dimensions are 125 feet over all, 103 feet water line, 25 feet 8 inches beam, and 11 feet 6 inches hold.

The vessel was built under the most rigid inspection and specifications, and all those who have seen her agree that she is their crowning efforts.

This new craft, which cost \$11,000, will be fitted for the general fishing under command of Capt. Emiel Mack.

W. C. Smith & Co., have also placed another order for a new vessel of the same dimension which will be ready in June.

Special Services For Fishermen at Churches Before Departure.

The first fishing schooners of the great Lunenburg, N. S., fleet sailed for the banks Monday on the early spring trip, and the water front was gay with bunting in their honor. The vessels to get away were schs. Lila B. Hirtle, Alexandria, Glenwood, Alma Nelson, Shamrock, and Acadia.

When these splendid vessels, the crack ones of the Lunenburg fleet, sailed from the harbor, they presented a fine sight. The weather was perfect, and the departure of these precursors of the famous Lunenburg fleet was marked with every prospect of success. With every stitch of canvas drawing, the vessels raced away, as though off for an ocean race.

In fact, this is quite true, as there is much friendly rivalry among the skippers and men, and each is determined to reach the grounds first. All these vessels baited with frozen herring from the Atlantic Fish Company's freezer.

Special sermons were delivered in the churches Sunday for the benefit of the departing fishermen. Schs. Transvaal, Ronald G. Smith, Juanita, Henry L. Montague, and Hiawatha belonging to W. G. Smith & Co., have been cleared at the custom house. Some of these sailed Monday night.

The St. John's, N. F., News, says: "All the bankers from Bruin, Belleoram, Burgeo and Ramea are now fishing on the Rose Blanche and Channel grounds. Capt. Sol. Jacobs Keeping Up His Former Good Records.

LANDED 13 BARRELS TODAY.

Fish Must Be Plentiful as He Lost a Big School While Setting.

Fortress Monroe, Va., March 30, 1908—Sch. A. M. Nicholson, Capt. Sol Jacobs, arrived with 1300 large mackerel caught 40 miles southeast of Cape Henry, reports schs. George Parker, Arthur James, Ingomar, Monarch and Grayling on the grounds. All well. No other fish."

This is the first mackerel fare landed this year and Capt. Jacobs, again wins his laurel of being the first to land mackerel.

In a private despatch to his wife, Capt. Jacobs, says, "At Fortress Monroe with 13 barrels, lost a big school."

No particulars as to the manner in which the fish were lost have been received.

Last year, Capt. Jacobs landed the first trip of 3500 mackerel at Fortress Monroe March 25, five days ahead of his record this year.
