FISH ARE WILD.

Fleet of Forty Sail Now Fishing on the Rips.

Few and Small Trips Are Bringing Very Small Prices.

Sch. Diana, Capt. James McLean, is at Boston this morning from off Sankaty Head, with 4500 large fresh mackerel, selling at 24 cents each.
 Sch. Arthur James, Capt. Archibald Devine, arrived at T wharf, Boston, yesterday afternoon with 5000 fresh mackerel, mostly large, and sold at 26 cents each for large and 16 cents for mediums.
 Schs. Mary T. Fallon and Saladin are down from Boston this morning.
 Schs. Lucania, Slade Gorton and Patricia are here this morning with small lots of salt mackerel.
 The present high prices for fresh mackerel are a great help now, as catches are small and the vessels making them are few.
 The vessels at Boston with fresh mackerel yesterday afternoon got their fish near the Rose and Crown shoal. There appeared to be quite a lot of fish there, but very wild and this, together with the shoal water, made them hard to catch. Vessels had been coming there every day and reporting no fish on Georges.
 The salt mackerel market does not appear to be very active. Sch. Natalie J. Nelson's lot, 28 barrels, went to the Gorton-Pew Fisheries Co. at \$9.25 per barrel. The fare of sch. Diana of 114 barrels are still on the owner's wharf. Schs. Juno and F. J. O'Hara, Jr., took their lots of 60 and 80 barrels respectively out with them again. Wm. H. Jordan & Co. took in the fare of sch. Lottie G. Merchant and the Gorton-Pew Fisheries Co. did the same on sch. Rob Roy's fare.

MADE MAIDEN TRIP.

New [Nova] Scotia Otter Trawler Started In Well.

Much interest has developed as to the outcome of the first trip of the steam trawler Wren, which arrived at Canso last week from Grimsby, England, where she had been purchased by A. N. Whitman for his firm, in conjunction with the C. Robin Collas Co., limited, and A. G. Jones & Co., of Halifax, N. S. No time was lost in fitting the new arrival out for her maiden trip on the 29th of June.
 Her skipper, Capt. Smith, and his crew of North Sea fishermen, with other trawl equipment, etc., returned to Canso Harbor on the 30th. They brought in 20,000 pounds haddock 10,000 pounds cod, and a considerable quantity of halibut and soles, between 30,000 and 40,000 in all, the result of only 20 hours fishing.
 They also obtained a large amount of other kinds of fish, unsalable in this market at present, but of substantial value in English and European centers. This promising beginning to the venture is considered as most encouraging by its enterprising promoters. The Wren will next operate around the Bay Chaleur district.

TWO GOOD MACKEREL TRIPS.

Schs. Arabia and Nellie Dixon Arrived at Boston This Afternoon.

Two fine fresh mackerel trips reached T wharf, Boston, this afternoon and both are getting fine prices. Sch. Arabia, Capt. Gourley Anderson, has 14,000 fish, mostly large the large, selling for 25 cents each, and sch. Nellie Dixon, Capt. James Ellis, has 5000 fish, selling at 26 cents for large and 16 cents for mediums.
 The Dominion Fish Bureau reports mackerel scarce all along the coast.
