PRICES DROP ON MACKEREL SPURT

The spurt of fresh mackerel which the gasoliners have been taking in Ipswich Bay the past few days caused prices to drop again yesterday, some selling as low as 2 3-4 cents a pound, as the result of which several barrels of fish went to salt.

Yesterday during the forenoon and afternoon, the boats arrived one by one at the Fort with mackerel and bluebacks. Some of the mackerel was placed in cold storage, while bluebacks were disposed of for bait, shipped. Some of the trips of bluebacks did not take out here at all, but were sent to Boston.

The storm of the morning drove many of the steamers back to port. Last evening a number of them harbored at Lanesville in and about the coves.

Capt. Charles H. Harty of steamer Bonita is loud in his praise of Capt. King of the Dolliver's Neck Life Saving Station, through whose valuable aid, the little steamer's seine boat and seine were recovered.

Labrador Shipments of 1912.

The Newfoundland-Labrador catch for 1912 exceeded that of 1911 by 30,000 quintals, being estimated at 430,000 quintals. There were 5,468 men and 827 vessels employed in the fishery, or 463 men and 87 vessels less than in 1911. The shipments of codfish from the Labrador coast direct to foreign markets in 1912 were 194,995 quintals, valued at 682,482, an increase over 1911 of 33,952 quintals in quantity and \$6,101 in values. Of these the United States took 2,400 quintals, Spain, 86,419, Italy 45,929, Greece 27,563 United States Kingdom 10,757, Portugal 7,537 and Canada 14,450.

Labrador Shipments of 1912.

The Newfoundland-Labrador catch for 1912 exceeded that of 1911 by 30,000 quintals, being estimated at 430,000 quintals. There were 5,468 men and 827 vessels employed in the fishery, or 463 men and 87 vessels less than in 1911. The shipments of codfish from the Labrador coast direct to foreign markets in 1912 were 194,995 quintals, valued at 682,482, an increase over 1911 of 33,952 quintals in quantity and \$6,101 in values. Of these the United States took 2,400 quintals, Spain, 86,419, Italy 45,929, Greece 27,563 United States Kingdom 10,757, Portugal 7,537 and Canada 14,450.
