LIGHT RECEIPTS AGAIN TODAY

SEINERS FOUND FEW MACKEREL OFF SHORE YES- DAY.

Local fish receipts were light again today, the seiners finding fish few and far off. The total mackerel receipts amounted to but 11,000 pounds. The off-shore dragger Herbert Parker took out 95,000 pounds of fresh fish at the General Seafoods corporation and the haddock Killarney came down from Boston for the Gorton-Pew Company with 140,000 pounds of fresh fish. Two large fares of fresh shad were landed here, but one fare was taken over to Provincetown for Cold Storage.

SIXTEEN BOATS IN BOSTON FLEET

LIGHT RECEIPTS THIS MORNING OF GROUND FISH, MACKEREL AND SWORDFISH.

Boston receipts were light this morning but were ample for the half day's session. They comprised 229,000 pounds of groundfish, 38,500 pounds of mackerel, 72,000 pounds of blink mackerel, 5,700 pounds of tinker mackerel and 42,000 pounds of mixed fish. There were 16 arrivals. Market remained about the same.

Haddock sold at \$2; large cod, \$4; markets, \$2.25; mackerel, 5 to 7 1/4 cents and swordfish, 7 to 14 1-4 cents per pound.

LOCAL VESSEL AIDS LAME DUCK

With a broken pump in her engine, and unable to proceed under her own power, the auxiliary fishing schooner Stranger of Boston was picked up by the Flora L. Oliver of this port, half a mile off Boston Light, early last night. The Stranger was heading out to sea with Capt. Andrew Meade who is also the owner, in command. When the accident to the pump occurred, the vessel was sighted by the Gloucester schooner almost immediately. The latter came alongside, and Capt. William Meuse offered to tow the crippled vessel to port.

THIRTY-SEVEN AT BOSTON PIER

FLEET HAS ALL VARIETIES— GROUND FISH RECEIPTS ARE HEAVY.

All varieties of fresh fish were in good supply at the Boston fish pier this morning. A fleet of 37 vessels was on hand and fares aggregated 1,740,000 pounds of groundfish, 94,000 pounds of halibut, 400,000 pounds of fresh mackerel, 375 swordfish, 160,000 pounds of mixed fish, 6,000 pounds of salt mackerel, and 30,000 pounds of saltfish. Prices were low on about everything except halibut which sold for 19 and 20 cents for white and 14 and 15 cents for gray.
