THREE ARRIVALS AT THIS PORT

TWO SEINERS ONLY CRAFT AT THIS PORT THIS MORNING.

Receipts of fish still continued light today, the only arrivals being three seiners, one with a good sized fare of mackerel and the other two with blink and blue backs. Sch. Dorcas arrived early last evening with 40,000 pounds of large fish which went to split because of icing conditions. The seiner Sawyer set around a school of blue-backs last night and took in 40 barrels and 500 blinks. The other arrival was the Virginia, a shore seiner with a small fare of mixed mackerel.

FOURTEEN AT BOSTON TODAY

SWORDFISH RECEIPTS HEAVY BUT OTHER VARIETIES ARE IN MODERATE SUPPLY.

Fourteen vessels were at the Boston fish pier this morning with groundfish, swordfish and a few mackerel. Total receipts were 320,000 pounds of groundfish, 562 swordfish, 22,500 pounds of mixed fish, 4000 pounds of mackerel; and 4000 pounds of blinks. The market was dull and prices remained low.

AN ODD FISH

CAUGHT BY TRAWLER

A huge monster of the deep, measuring 23 feet in length, with two long rows of ugly-looking teeth, was swept up from the waters of Georges Bank last Tuesday by the steam trawler Ripple, in at the Fish Pier, yesterday. The fish, slate colored and having white stripes around the body, was thought to be of the shark species, but no one on board the steamer had ever seen anything like it. The creature was evidently in pursuit of a school of smaller fish when the dragnet of the Ripple closed in about the whole lot of them. The stranger resisted capture, and put up a stiff battle before being subdued.

Rather than bring the shark, or what ever it was, to port, Capt. Thomas decided to throw it overboard, and gave directions that the carcass be cut up into three pieces and heaved back into the sea. Thus the hunter was transformed into food for the hunted.

Sell Craft Today.

The fishing sch. Mary T. Fallon, one of the veterans of the New England fleet, being 28 years old, was to be sold at noon today at a United States marshal's sale, at East Gloucester to satisfy claims brought against her. The sale takes place at the Amos Story wharf at noon. The Fallon was built at Essex in 1901, registers 74 tons gross and is equipped with a gasoline engine.
