SPLITTERS GOT SOME FISH TODAY

SCH. JOHN J. FALLON BROUGHT FARE FROM BOSTON FOR GORTON-PEW.

One trip was brought here from Boston during the night, and this morning went to split at the Pew wharf, where sch. John J. Fallon tied up from the Fish pier with 70,000 pounds on board. The new dragger Amherst of the General Seafoods corporation pulled in from sea during the night with 100,000 pounds on board, and the fare went to fillet. The dragger Leretha developed clutch trouble on her trip, and returned yesterday afternoon with 5000 pounds of haddock. These were the only arrivals since yesterday except the gill netters, who brought in 9000 pounds of fish.

BAKER'S DOZEN AT HUB TODAY

RECEIPTS NEARLY 700,000 POUNDS —MARKET WAS FIRM WITH HIGHER PRICES.

A fleet of 13 craft brought their fares to the Boston fish pier this morning. Total receipts were 665,000 pounds of groundfish, 2500 pounds of halibut and 25,000 pounds of mixed fish. The market was good and prices higher. Haddock sold at \$3.50; large cod, \$3 to \$4; market cod, \$2 to \$3.

ANOTHER BIG WEEK AT PIER

Receipts of groundfish at the Boston fish pier for the week ending March 7 were 6,019,300 pounds. There were 126 arrivals. In the corresponding week of 1929 there were 133 arrivals and the receipts were 6,708,900 pounds.

From January 1 to date there have been 1184 arrivals and receipts of 49,341,350 pounds of fresh fish. In the same period of 1929, there were 1064 arrivals and receipts of 46,429,425 pounds of fresh fish.

Groundfish were in good supply through the week and a number of good catches were landed, mostly from Georges. Groundfish was in good demand and a few fares were disposed of for salting and canning. Haddock sold during the week to wholesale dealers at \$2.75 to \$5.50; large cod, \$2.75 to \$4.50 and markets, \$2.50 to \$5.

Canadian Smelts.
Canadian frozen smelts have been in fair demand, selling to wholesale dealers at 25 cents per pound for extras, 18 cents for No. 1's and seven cents for No. 2's. It is reported that there are only two more cars to come forward this season.

HEAVY RECEIPTS AT BOSTON PIER

THIRTY-FOUR ARRIVALS HAVE OVER 2,000,000 POUNDS THIS MORNING.

A fleet of 34 craft brought fares to the Boston fish pier this morning. Most of them were loaded, too, and the total receipts amounted to 1,922,000 pounds of groundfish, 190,000 pounds of mixed fish and two lots of halibut that aggregated 6000 pounds. The market was fair. Haddock opened at \$3 to \$3.50; large cod, \$3 to \$4 and markets, \$2.50 to \$3.
