TWENTY-FOUR VESSELS HAVE 1,500,000 POUNDS—ONE HALIBUTER IN.

Dealers on the Boston fish pier had another large supply of fresh fish available again this morning. Most of the 24 craft comprising the incoming fleet were "loaded." Total receipts were 1,326,000 pounds of ground-fish, 41,500 pounds of halibut, 166,000 pounds of mixed fish and 15,000 pounds of salt fish.

The market took a drop from yesterday. Haddock sold at \$2 to \$3; large cod, \$3 and markets, \$2 to \$2.50.
