The off-shore dragger Ruth and Margaret arrived direct with a fare of 100,000 pounds of fish for the General Seafods corporation, and the halibuter Pilgrim which took out at Boston yesterday brought her fresh and salt fish to Davis Brothers. Gill netters brought in around 30,000 pounds of fresh fish yesterday afternoon.

## TWENTY-ONE IN BOSTON FLEET

**BIG SUPPLY OF MACKEREL ON  
HAND—POLLYANNA HAS  
16,000 HALIBUT.**

Plenty of fish was available for dealers on the Boston fish pier this morning. Twenty-one vessels were on hand, including a dozen seiners, when trading began. Total receipts were 320,000 pounds of groundfish, 343,000 pounds of fresh mackerel, 16,000 pounds of halibut and 20,000 pounds of saltfish. Groundfish were a little higher, haddock advancing to \$3.50. Large cod brought \$3 and market cod, \$2; mackerel, 3 1/4 to 3.55 cents.
