TWENTY-THREE ARRIVALS THIS MORNING ALL WITH GROUND AND FLAT FISH.

Receipts at the Boston fish pier this
morning comprised 730,000 pounds of
groundfish and 106,000 pounds of mixed
fish. There were 23 arrivals. The fare
of one beam trawler, the Tide, was not
reported. There were no seiners and no
mackerel receipts. The market was low-
er. Haddock sold at \$3.75, large cod, \$6
and markets, \$3.
