# BOSTON FLEET IS BIG TODAY

### RECEIPTS ARE HEAVY AND RUN WELL OVER 2,500,000 POUNDS.

A fleet of 53 craft, including 11 seiners and a netter, brought fares to the Boston fish pier this morning for one of the biggest days on record. Receipts went well over the 2,500,000 pounds mark and comprised 1,845,000 pounds of groundfish, 476,000 pounds of blink mackerel, 2500 pounds of large mackerel and 220,000 pounds of mixed fish. One fare was not reported.

The market was fair on the opening with haddock at \$3.50, large cod, \$5 and markets \$3. Mackerel brought three cents per pound.
