TWO NETTERS LAND MACKEREL

**SOMS OF FLEET HAS GIVEN UP
AND SHIFTED TO
DRAGGING.**

Two of the mackerel netters returning from two nights' fishing, landed small fares of fresh mackerel this forenoon. One boat took 100 pounds and the other 120 pounds. Some of the netting fleet, particularly the Italian fleet are beginning to haul out and already a few have turned to shore dragging.

Fresh fish receipts this morning included three off-shore draggers and three shore draggers. Gill netters landed 128,000 pounds of fresh fish yesterday, mostly pollock.

A fleet of 19 craft found their way to the Boston fish pier this morning to close up a fairly busy week. Fares were not large. Total receipts were 451,000 pounds of groundfish and 45,700 pounds of mixed fish. The market remained fairly strong with haddock at \$5; large cod, \$6 and markets \$4.
