

SEVENTEEN AT BOSTON TODAY

RECEIPTS OF 430,000 POUNDS FRESH FISH—MARKET ABOUT SAME.

A fleet of 17 vessels brought their fares to the Boston fish pier this morning. Receipts were 430,000 pounds of ground fish and 31,500 pounds of mixed fish. The market remained strong with prices about the same as yesterday. Haddock sold for \$5.50 to \$6.50; large cod, \$9 to \$10 and markets, \$5.

Capt. Greenwood Dead.

LAST MISSING SCHOONER OF NEWFOUNDLAND SAFE

The arrival of the sch. Lloyd Jack at Great Burin was reported yesterday. All of the 10 schooners that left St. John's, N. F., for Bonavista ports on November 29 and had been lost temporarily in recent storms now have been accounted for.

All were well on the Lloyd Jack. Capt. Eldon Bishop said the vessel was driven 250 miles to sea by the hurricane that scattered the fleet soon after it sailed.

NORMAL SUPPLY AT HUB TODAY

RECEIPTS OF HALF MILLION POUNDS—MARKET QUITE STRONG.

Fifteen craft furnished the fish supply for dealers on the Boston fish pier this morning. Total receipts were 425,000 pounds of groundfish and 83,000 pounds of mixed fish. The market remained about the same. Haddock was quoted at \$5 to \$6 on the opening; large cod, \$8 to \$8.60, and markets, \$4 to \$5.
