Several arrivals of fresh fish were reported during the forenoon, at Boston five seiners being included in the list. Boat Bethulia brought in 12,000 pounds of mixed mackerel, which were shipped to outside markets by the Producers' Fish Company. The other four seiners had small receipts of mackerel, and quite a lot of bluebacks. The dragger Doris F. Amero reported at the General Seafoods plant with 60,000 pounds of fresh fish. Eight gill netters lifted their gear yesterday and landed a total catch of 42,000 pounds of fresh fish.

TEN IN BOSTON FLEET TODAY

FEW MACKEREL AND ONE
SWORDFISH TRIP LANDED—
MARKET IS GOOD.

Receipts were small at the Boston fish pier this morning and were about ample for the half day session. Ten vessels were in the dock and they brought in 286,000 pounds of groundfish, 50,500 pounds of fresh mackerel, 4000 pounds of bullseye mackerel, 23 swordfish and 44,000 pounds of mixed fish. Market continued fairly strong.

When the Boston fish pier opened for trading this morning, there were 47 craft at the dock. Sixteen seiners had 290,000 pounds of fresh mackerel. Other receipts were 1,301,000 pounds of groundfish; 166 swordfish, 178,000 pounds of mixed fish, 12,000 pounds of halibut, 2000 pounds of butterfish and 12,000 pounds of saltfish. PLENTY OF FISH FOR EVERYONE

LOCAL MARKET GOT A GOOD SUPPLY OF ALL KINDS TODAY.

Local dealers had plenty of fish over the week-end, and up to noon today, about 120,000 pounds of mackerel had been landed at the various wharves. Fresh fish receipts this morning were good for Monday, there being five draggers with a total catch of 240,000 pounds.

Four of the draggers went to the General Seafoods and the fifth to Gorton-Pew for filleting. Gill netters hit pretty good fishing Saturday and yesterday, 10 boats lifting a catch of 98,000 pounds of fresh fish for the two days. Mackerel receipts this morning were handled by the Producers Fish Company, Powers & McDonald, John Chianciola and The Progressive Fish Company.

BEAM TRAWLER HAS NICE FARE

BOSTON STEAMER AT THE PEW WHARF WITH 140,000 POUNDS COD.

The Boston beam trawler Brant with 140,000 pounds of fresh fish for splitting, came down from Boston early last evening, and this morning unloaded her fare at the Gorton-Pew Fisheries Company. The Brant at Boston yesterday, landed what dealers claim is the largest single fare of fresh cod ever taken out at the pier. Of the 175,000 pounds of fish in her holds, 125,000 pounds ran codfish. Local arrivals since yesterday, aside from the Brant, were the halibuter Pollyanna for the Gorton-Pew Company with fresh and salt fish, two small mackerel fares and a dragger at the Producers' Fish Company, and a small trawler at the Commercial Fish company. Ten gill netters hauled yesterday, their total catch being in the neighborhood of 30,000 pounds.

FOUR SEINERS AT HUB TODAY

HAVE 85,000 POUNDS FRESH MACKEREL—PLENTY OF GROUND FISH AVAILABLE

The arriving fleet at the Boston fish pier this morning numbered 27, including four seiners and two with swordfish. Receipts were 850,000 pounds of groundfish, 85,000 pounds of fresh mackerel; 80,000 pounds of mixed fish; and 149 swordfish. The market continued strong.

Haddock sold at \$3.50; large cod, \$6 and markets, \$2. Mackerel had three gradings, 6.70 to 7 for tinkers; 10 to 11 for small and medium and four cents for tacks.

there is a little better showing, but every settlement complains of scarcity of bait. Placentia Bay and point along the South East coast report a scarcity. The Northern fishery, however, is much better, and will help to swell the total catch. From Battie Harbor, and vicinity we learn that there is a fair sign of bait and consequently the fishermen are doing well. The latest news from Labrador points is also encouraging, but the season is well advanced. The banking schooners have also done poorly. New fish arriving during the week is much better than that received a fortnight ago, as weather conditions for drying purposes have been much more favorable. We again advise fishermen to use every means in their power to make superior fish.—St. John's Trade Review
